

James H. Race Succumbs At 83

Retired Farmer Dies In Kunkle

James H. Race, 83, was buried in Beaumont Cemetery yesterday afternoon, following funeral services conducted from the Paul Nutton Funeral Home by Rev. Ruth L. Underwood and Rev. Samuel Arendt.

Mr. Race died Monday afternoon at the home of his son, Leon, who lived next door. He had been in failing health for some months, but not seriously ill until the middle of September.

He was a native of Vernon, son of the late William and Eunice Hallock Race. For the past fifty-six years he lived on the farm at Kunkle, in later years turning over its operation to his son Leon.

Mr. Race was a member of Kunkle Methodist Church. He served on the Dallas Township school board, completing a term, and was elected to another term, a number of years ago. For the past several years he had been increasingly inactive.

Survivors include three sons, Leon, Kunkle; John, Idstown and Andrew, Beaumont; a daughter, Mrs. Hulda Gaston, Bladensburg, Md.; five grandchildren; a brother, Albert of Vernon, and a sister, Mrs. Minnie Grey, Harpersville, N. Y.

Pall-bearers were Race cousins: Lawrence, William, Charles, Ernest, Russell, and Russell Race, Jr.
