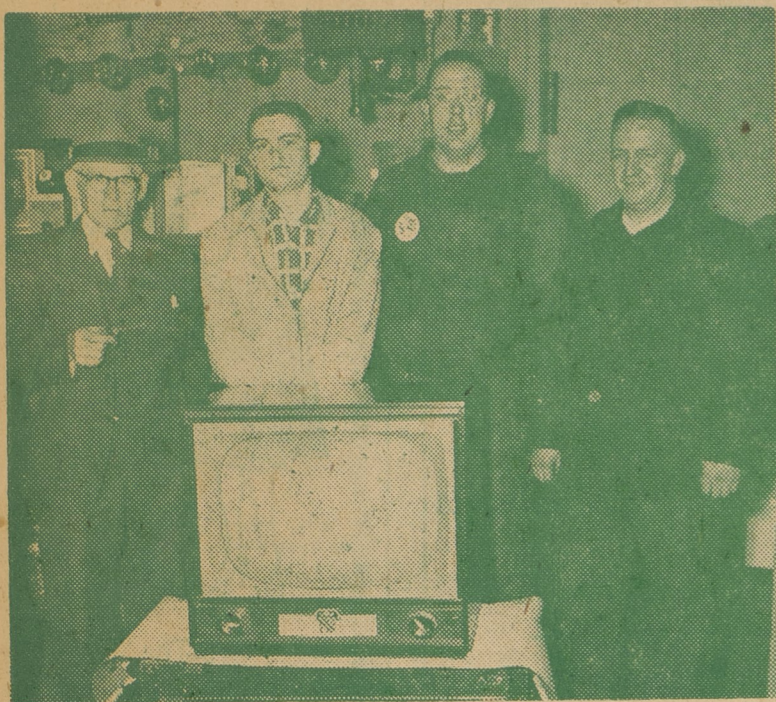


Wins Television Set

space for 500 folding chairs.
At night the school can be seen from far down the valley, its gymnasium windows and full length glass doors radiant. From every window there is a beautiful view. Bus students alight dry-shod, discharged under a protecting canopy. There is an enormous parking area, with a semicircular drive. There will be further grading and landscaping in the spring to make the setting complete. The newly surfaced road through Sweet Valley adds to the attractiveness of the

location.
To Ross Township residents, the grade school is a dream come true. Construction of a grade school was missed it by a hairsbreadth before World War II, when Public Works sponsorship could have been obtained. School board members now are pleased that the original plan did not go through, as many modern improvements were unheard of at that time. The present school incorporates the best in modern construction. A few features remain to be worked for, with PTA members eager to work toward such additions. One of the first will be a stage at the far end of the gymnasium, a bit of construction which had to be regrettably sidetracked, though part of the original plan

as worked out by Lacy, Atherton and Davis, architects, and figured on by Raymon Hedden, contractor.
In charge of the sixth grade is Arthur Curtis, former teacher of the Mott school; fifth grade, Delbert Hines, Broadway; fourth, Myron Moss, Mooretown; third, Mrs. Beatrice Cragle, Center; second, Mrs. Dorothy LaBar, Hook; first, Mrs. Arthur Curtis, Frisbie. Bloomingdale, the seventh school was not opened this fall, pupils accommodated at the other six schools.
Arthur Cragle is custodian, Mrs. Hattie Cragle and Mrs. Florence Shaw form the cafeteria staff.
George Bronson is chairman of the Ross Township Authority Board, Robert Gray vice-chairman, Basil Steele secretary, McKinley Long treasurer, and Caleb Hoyt member. The school board is headed by Charles Long, and includes Paul Crocket, Jesse Hann, William Birth and Alfred Bronson.
