

Wm. F. Sliker Dies Suddenly Widow Collapses Goes To Hospital

William F. Sliker, Machell Avenue, was buried in Vestal Hill Memorial Cemetery last Friday, following services in Johnson City. He died last Monday morning of a heart attack, an hour after admission to Nesbitt Memorial Hospital. Dr. A. A. Mascali, summoned at 7 a.m., called Kingston Township ambulance, which conveyed him to the hospital.

Mr. Sliker, 67, had lived with his daughter, Mrs. Helen L. Smith, for the past three years, since retirement from employment with the International Business Machine Co. at Endicott.

Mrs. Sliker, overcome by her husband's sudden death, collapsed and was rushed to Nesbitt Hospital Wednesday morning.

Mrs. Sliker is improving under a regime of complete rest.

Mr. Sliker was born at Pocono Lake, resided in Ricketts, Renovo, and for seventeen years in Johnson City.

He is survived by his father, Charles W. Sliker, Sinnemahoning; his widow, the former Leila Barnhart of Ricketts; eight children: Fay E., William H., and Mrs. Robert S. Minckler, Johnson City; C. Alton, Bruce, and Mrs. Theodore W. Pier, son, Vestal; Charles W., Endwell, N. Y. and Mrs. Smith, Dallas; thirteen grandchildren; a brother, George, of Cameron, and two sisters, Mrs. Bruce Eisenhower, Culver, and Mrs. Arthur Heller, Stroudsburg.


Mrs. Warren Johnson was pleasantly surprised by her brothers and sisters who came up from Wilkes-Barre to help her celebrate her birthday Sunday.
