He is the son of Mrs. Mary Shakalum of Park Avenue, Wilkes-Barre.

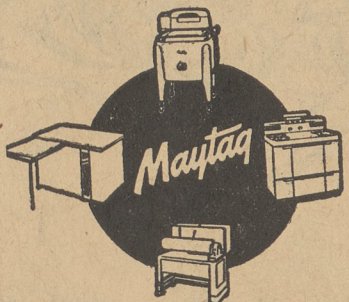

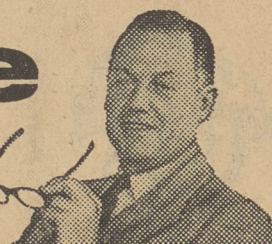

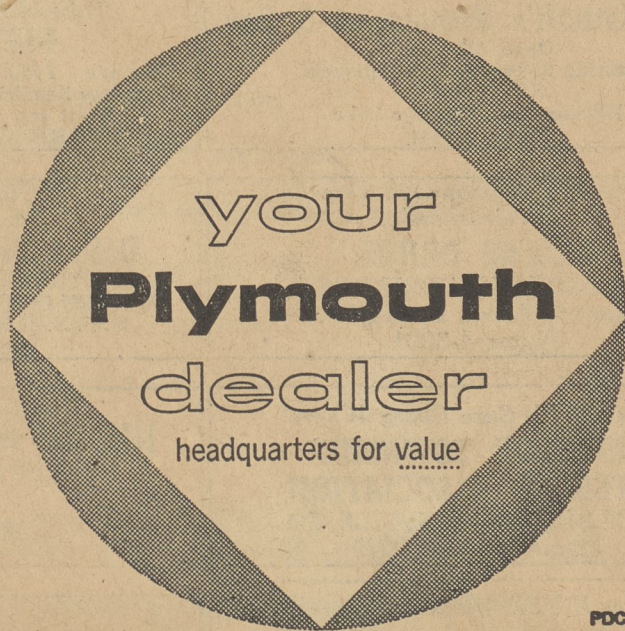
