erty owners.

Misleading articles and half truths in Wilkes-Barre newspapers, he said, have been damaging to the community.

Jordan Gives Figures

Dr. Jordan showed charts of figures on relative expense of putting up a five township or a seven township high school. Monroe Township, he stated, is geographically assimilable by the Back Mountain system, with its population leaning toward Wilkes-Barre as a shopping center instead of Tunkhannock. The residents are Back Mountain minded. The school system has been released by Wyoming County pending possible jointure.

Dr. Jordan stressed the necessity

for finding actual need before figuring out a plan of jointure or building. He called attention to the foolishness of a prospective house-owner who might wave \$30,000 at a contractor and tell him to go ahead, without weighing needs of the family, game-room against extra bedroom, paved terrace against front porch.

Panel Discussion

Cards passed through the audience brought a variety of questions to panel members.

"Why the necessity of three attorneys for a joint system?" Dr. Bodycomb answered that for a union system only one would be necessary, but that under the present set-up he could not see Kingston Township or Dallas Borough accepting with complete amiability an alien solicitor's findings on a controversial subject.

James Hutchison, in replying to

a question, "Do you think that administrative personnel has perhaps hindered larger jointure?", said briefly, "Could be."

Bids will be received for the entire issue. Said bonds and interest thereon will be payable without deduction for any tax or taxes, except succession or inheritance taxes, now or hereafter levied or assessed thereon under any present or future law of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, all of which taxes the Borough of Dallas assumes and agrees to pay. The bonds will be sold to the highest responsible bidder provided such bid is not less than par and accrued interest.

The highest responsible bidder shall be the one who, having complied with the conditions of sale, offers to take the whole issue at the lowest interest cost to the municipality, which shall be determined by deducting from the total amount of interest to be paid on account of such bonds, during the life thereof, the amount of premium offered, if any, over and above the face amount of the issue.

Bonds will be dated March 1, 1954, may be registered as to principal only, and will mature as follows:

Bids will be received up to 7:30 o'clock E. S. T. on March 16, 1954, at which time they will be opened in the Council rooms in the Borough Building, Dallas, Pa.

Bids must be accompanied by a certified check, cashier's check or treasurer's check, drawn to the order of the Treasurer of the Borough of Dallas, or a sum of money equal to two per centum of the face amount of the bonds, as security against any loss resulting from the failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of the said bid. The deposit of each unsuccessful bidder will be returned immediately upon the award of the bonds or the rejection of all bids. In the case of the successful bidder, the deposit will be held by the Treasurer and will be applied on the purchase price when the bonds are actually delivered and paid for.

These obligations will be payable from the ad valorem taxes within the taxing limitations imposed by law upon boroughs of this class. The enactment, at any time prior to the delivery of the bonds, of Federal legislation which in terms, by the repeal or omission of exemption or otherwise, subjects to a Federal income tax the interest on bonds of a class or character which includes these bonds, will at the election of the purchaser, relieve the purchaser from his obligation under the terms of the contract of sale and entitle the purchaser to the return of the amount deposited with the bid.

These bonds are issued subject to the favorable opinion of B. B. LEWIS, Esq., of Dallas, Pa. and will be delivered to the purchaser only if and after the proceedings authorizing the issuance thereof have been approved by the Department of Internal Affairs of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

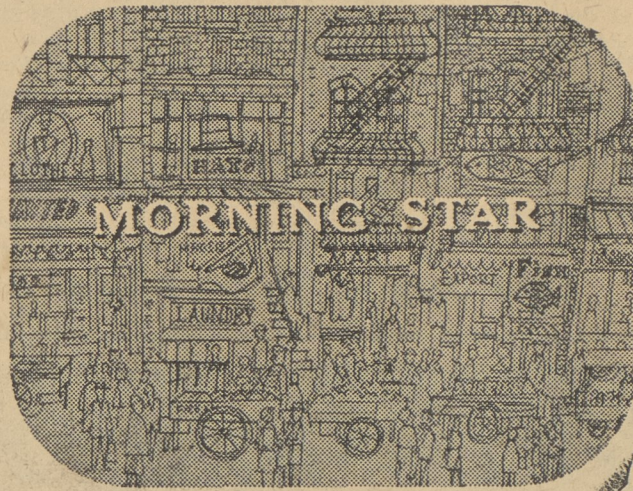

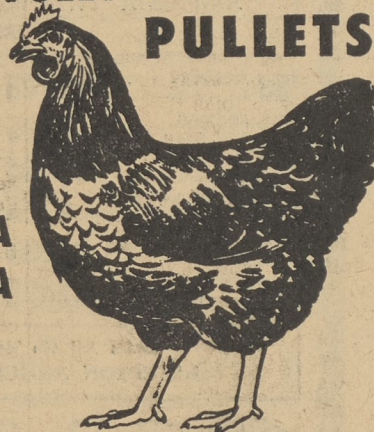


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
