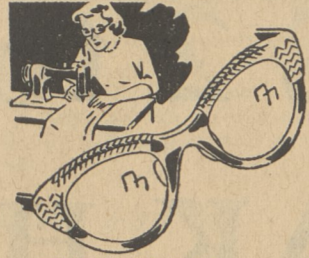
This announcement was made by Rev. Robert DeWitt Yost at the Board of Management meeting on Monday night.

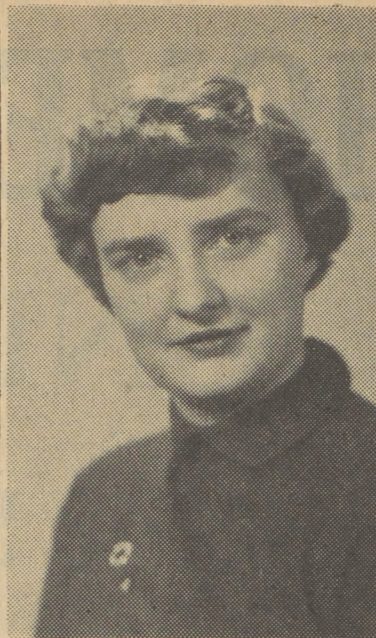

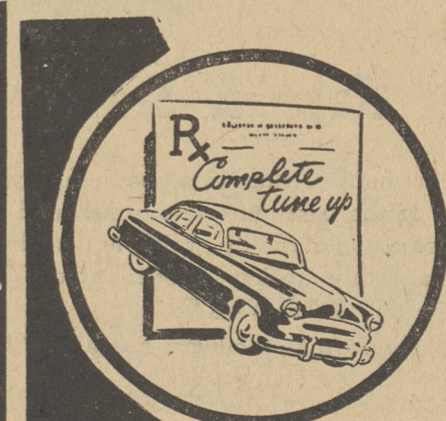
