Mr. and Mrs. Clifton King have returned to their home at Dayton, Pa., after spending a few days with the Clarence Hilberts.

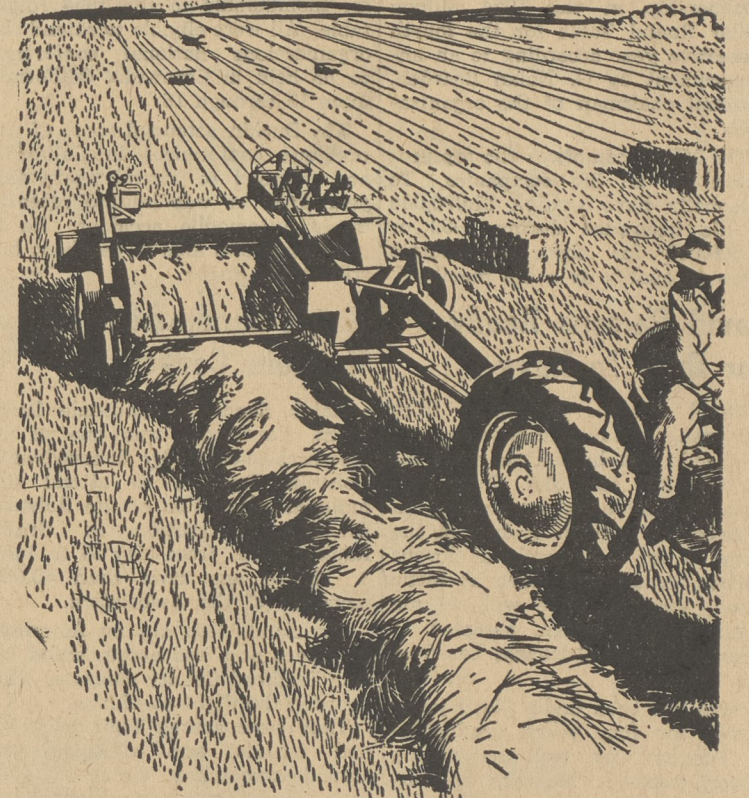
Jane Gary is visiting her sister, Mrs. James Oberst, at Jersey City, N. J.

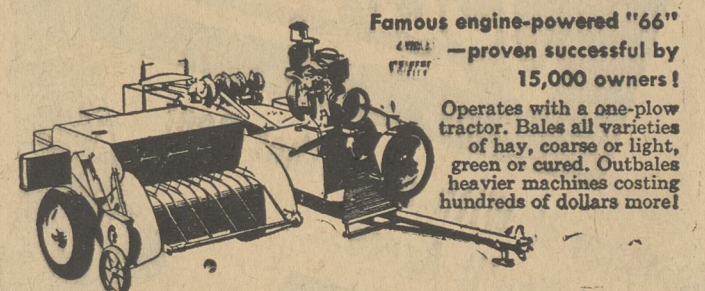
