Westmoreland Invites Everybody To Christmas Program Tonight

Westmoreland high school Christmas program will be given tonight in the auditorium as a community service, free to all. It is in two parts, the first reflecting the traditional merry-making of the Christmas season, the second the religious significance. The meaning of Christmas is told to two children,

The high school band ends this part of the program with favorite Christmas songs.

"The First Noel" is sung by the entire assembly; the Mixed Chorus gives "Gloria in Excelsis Deo"; Nancy Jane Jones and Ruthellen Hammond sing "Gesu Bambino"; Joan Sickler and Roberta Williams present a duet on flutes; Junior High Boys Ensemble sing two Bohemian carols; Mixed Chorus sings "Come Immanuel," and Junior High Girls sing a Sussex Carol. The program ends with the Hallelujah Chorus.

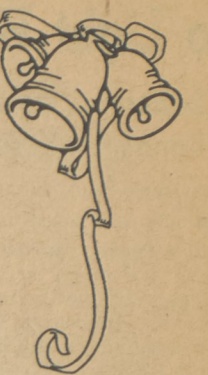

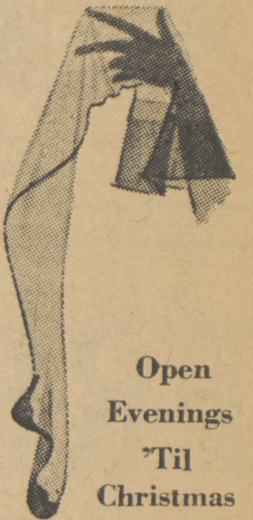

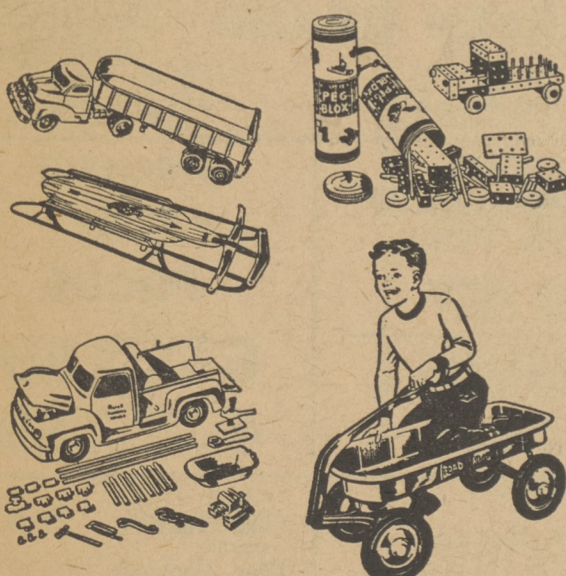
