Native Honors Two Executives

Gerstle and Carver With Firm 25 Years

Two company executives who devoted 25 years of service to Native Laces & Textiles, Inc., were honored with speeches and presentations at the Della Robbia Room of the Hotel Vanderbilt, New York, Tuesday night, on the occasion of the com-

pany's annual dinner-dance. Gustave Gerstle, vice president in charge of production, and James Carver, president of Carver Lace (a Native affiliate) were Works both cited for their contributions to the firm's more than fifty years as an important lace factor.

With the company's entire New York staff and mill representatives present, Leon Birnbaum, Chairman of the Board of Directors, and Mathew Birnbaum, President, paid tribute to the two men. They commented on Native's position as largest lace producer in the world, and attributed much credit for having achieved that position to Messrs. Gerstle and Carver.

Although neither man is American born, the business careers of both were described as true "Horatio Alger" stories. Mr. Gerstle came to this country from Constance, Germany, and started as a stockboy in 1929. His current position brings him into contact with almost every branch of the business; he directs all the company's affiliated mills, specializing in production details, labor negotiations and personnel problems



More Fatal Accidents In Home Than On Road

More people died from accidents occurring in Pennsylvania homes last year (1953) than were killed in automobile accidents on the Commonwealth's highways, it was reported today by the Bureau of Statistics and Records, Pennsylvania Department of Health.

Accidental falls accounted for the majority of the home accident fatalities, according to the report. It places home accidents ninth among the leading causes of death in the State for 1953. Total number of deaths from accidents in the home were 1,890, according to data compiled by Dr. Albert E. Bailey, Director, Bureau of Statistics and Records.






