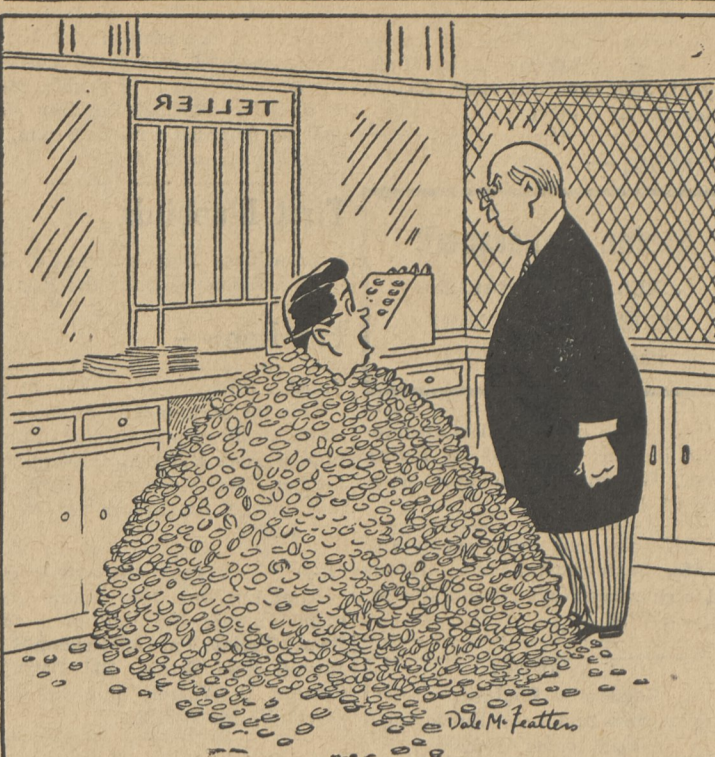
Shavertown remained in a first place tie on its hard earned 45-43 win over East Dallas for its fourth straight win. Hontz with 21 and
