The truck has been equipped with two transmissions, giving it 12 forward speeds and three reverse gears. On the front of the truck is a power winch with 300 feet of cable; mounted above that is a front mounted fire engine pump. Mounted under the truck chassis is a generator capable of lighting 14 100-watt electric light bulbs. There is also an air compressor mounted under the chassis. The Ashmen's also carry in the truck fire extinguishers, axes, shovels and various other tools.
