Twelve whistling swans were reported on Sylvan Lake, and several varieties of wild ducks at Huntsville Dam and Harveys Lake, among them American golden-eye bufflehead, rose-breasted and American Merganser, teal, wood-ducks, pied-billed grebe, eared grebe, and coot. Charts showing summer and winter birds were on view. Edwin Johnson presided.
