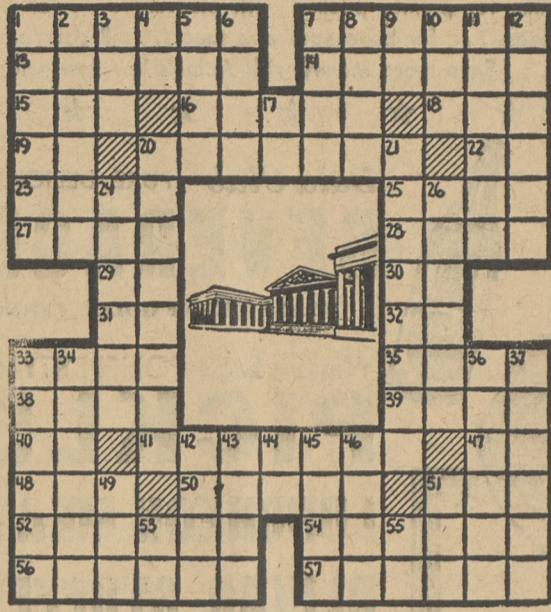

## Your Health

### From The Luzerne County Medical Society

Overweight persons can no longer claim they are fat because of some glandular disorder.

This has been found to be a false premise, and the general public is getting to know it.

Nor is obesity commonly due to any organic disease.

In most cases, overweight is the result of overeating and therein lies the big problem.

No drug has yet been discovered that will safely and effectively control the appetite.

With almost mathematical predictability, however, loss of overweight can be produced in any obese person who adopts a low caloric diet under strict supervision.

It is the maintenance of his diet that is difficult.

A person who has reduced his caloric intake and has lost a few pounds, tends to have an increased feeling of well-being.

But as he continues his efforts

to reduce, an uncontrollable hunger sets in so that he becomes obsessed with thoughts of food.

It is not easy to abstain, for at every social gathering he is offered fattening food and his family sits down to a table laden with tempting dishes.

Reducing is a long, hard process accompanied by a sense of frustration, failure, mental torture, and actually painful hunger contractions.

The commonest cause of obesity is recognized as due to emotional conflict.

Restricting the intake of food does not diminish the urge to eat.

Every overweight patient has to be studied in terms of his body build and emotional history.

Fat persons are defined as those who are 20 per cent over the ideal weight.

Overweight persons are involved in 15 per cent more accidents than those not overweight.

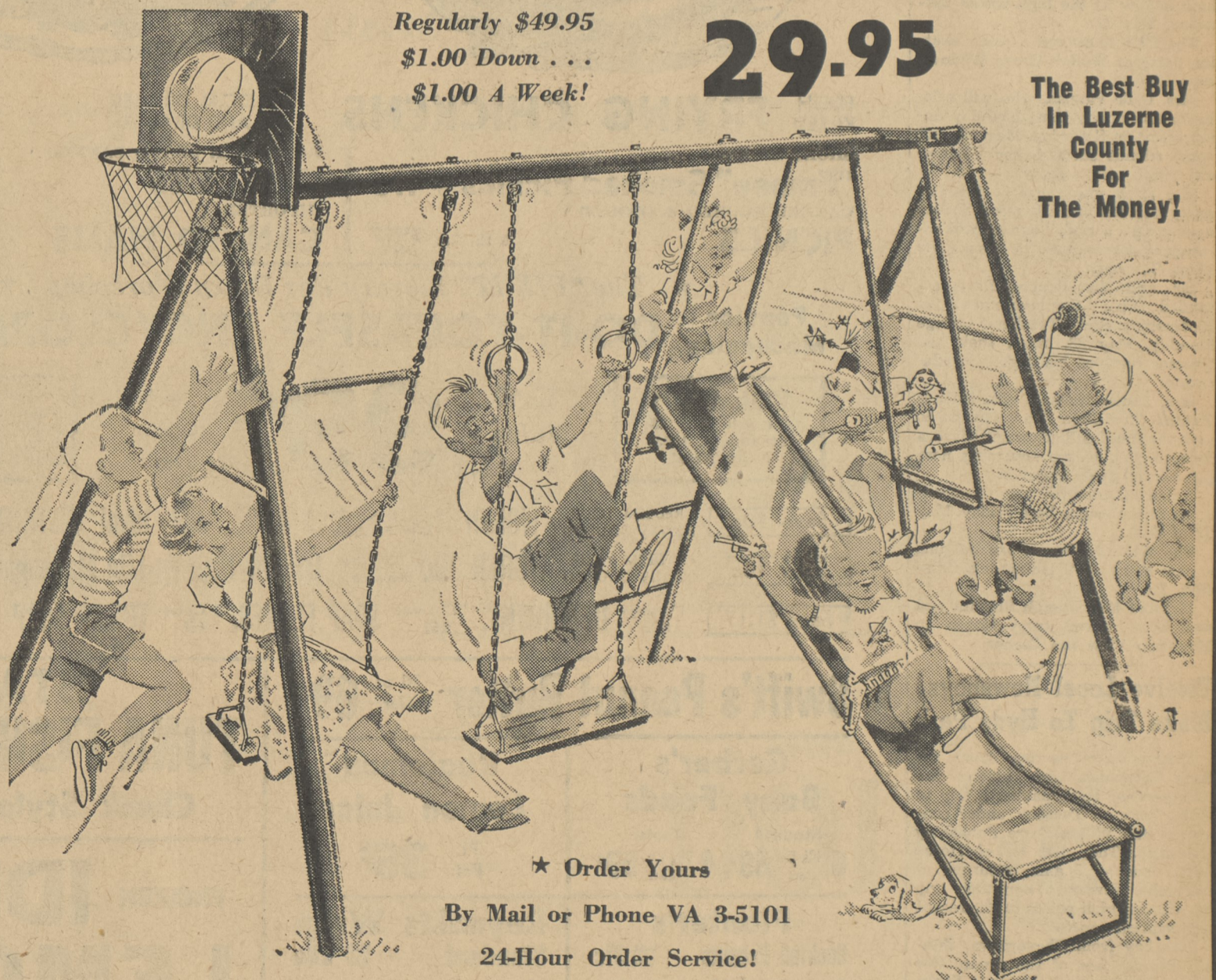
