Mrs. George Arzente of Huntsville, one of the winners in the baking contest held at the Gate of Heaven Dallas Fiesta, has given us her prize recipe for Pineapple Upside Down Cake. Its good flavor and keeping quality has made it one of her favorite cakes.

Pineapple Upside Down Cake

Topping: 2 tablespoons butter or margarine 1/2 cup brown sugar 5 slices pineapple 9 maraschino cherries

Batter:

2 tablespoons butter or margarine 1/2 cup hot milk 2 eggs 1 cup sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla 1 cup sifted flour 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder

Melt butter in cake pan. Add brown sugar and blend. Arrange pineapple slices and maraschino cherries over this mixture.

In mixing bowl beat eggs until very thick and lemon colored, gradually add sugar and continue beating. Add vanilla and mix. Add butter to hot milk. Sift together the dry ingredients. Add dry ingredients alternately with the liquid to the egg mixture. Blend. Pour over pineapple. Bake in 350° oven for 40 minutes. Remove from oven and let stand 10 minutes. Invert on cake dish.
