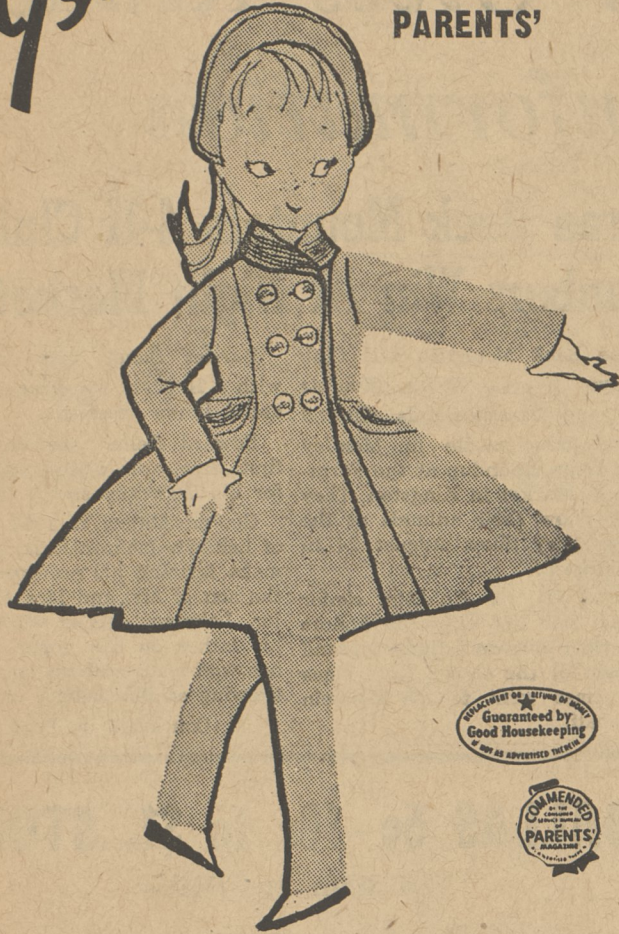

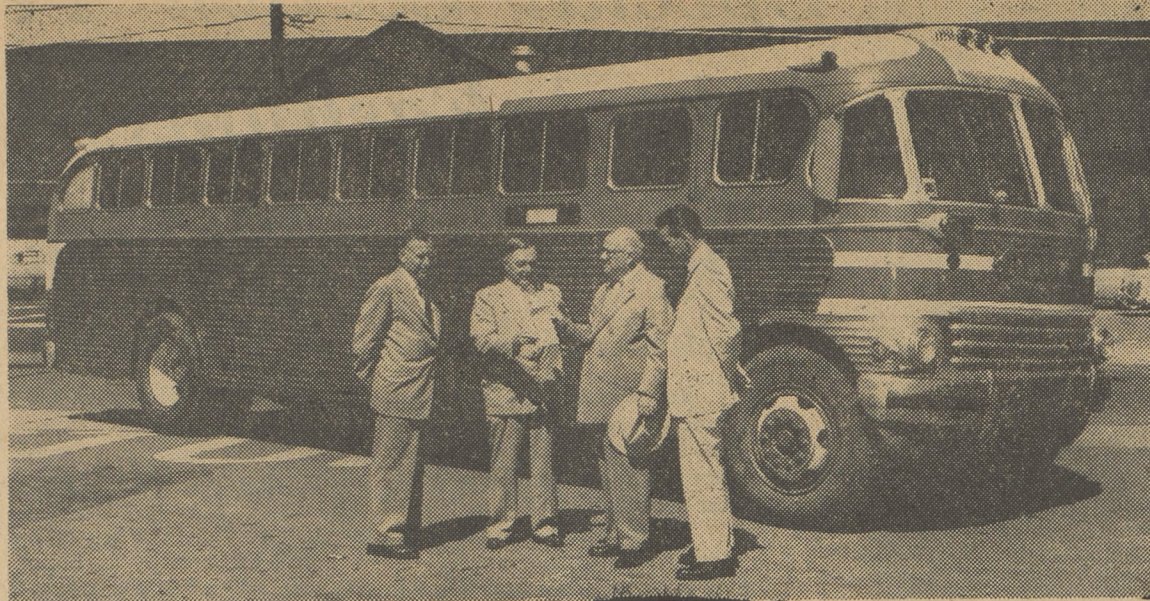

Niezgoda Says "Game Is For The Boys"

"The Back Mountain Little League certainly has run into its share of trouble this season and the only way it can be helped is by a better understanding between parents, officials, personnel and the players themselves."

This was the opinion expressed this week by Joe Niezgoda who has always had the best interests of young people at heart. In a letter to The Post Mr. Niezgoda added: "Games are getting to the point where fans are expecting professional talent from boys 8 to 12 years of age. Umpiring toward the end of the season falters; fans don't sit in the stands and cheer the boys, but watch the game from their automobiles and use their horns for cheering or booing."

"Criticism of managers, umpires, officials and anybody connected with the game comes via the grapevine of fans sitting in their automobiles."

"Teams in top contention, playing and being defeated soundly by teams in lower standing, can't take defeat in stride. Striving only to win is degrading to Little League Baseball. They protest the game to pull it out of the fire by trying to find some technicality. This only creates hard feeling among otherwise good neighbors and good contributors."

"One thing we must remember," Mr. Niezgoda concluded, Little League Baseball is for the boys."

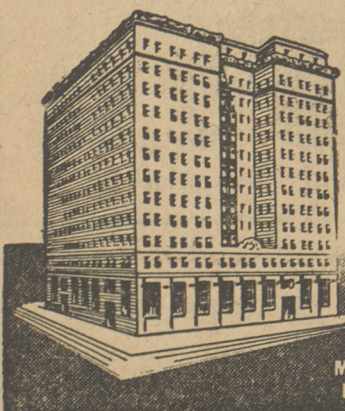

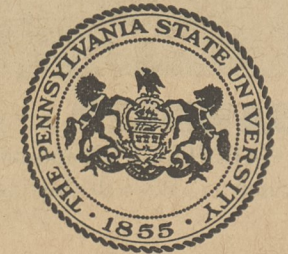
