

# 10 Toll Bridges To Be Free Soon

Highway Secretary Says Possible In '57

Secretary of Highways Joseph J. Lawler reported that since the Commonwealth took over operation of 10 toll brides in 1949, tolls amounting to \$6,411,086.44 have been col-

In addition the State has collected \$135,626.34 interest on investments and deposits.

The net cost of the brides was \$7,808,413.20 with the Commonwealth assuming outstanding bonds and miscellaneous cost of \$429,-722.26 or a total net cost of \$8,-238,135.46. The net cost in excess of tolls and interest as of August 31, 1955 was \$1,691,422.68.

In a forecast of the approximate date the bridges will be free, Department statisticians figure at the present rate of traffic using the bridges, it can be expected early in 1957.

It is pointed out, however, that this forecast is based entirely and completely on the present trend in traffic, the condition of all of the bridges in their present form and the possible development of a system of free bridges in the immediate vicinity of existing toll struc-

The original legislation authorizing the States to take over the toll bridges specified that none of the bridges would be free until the State has collected the total cost of the structures.
