Mrs. Bruce Williams who observed her birthday on Monday was surprised on Sunday at a little party given to her by her Sunday School class.

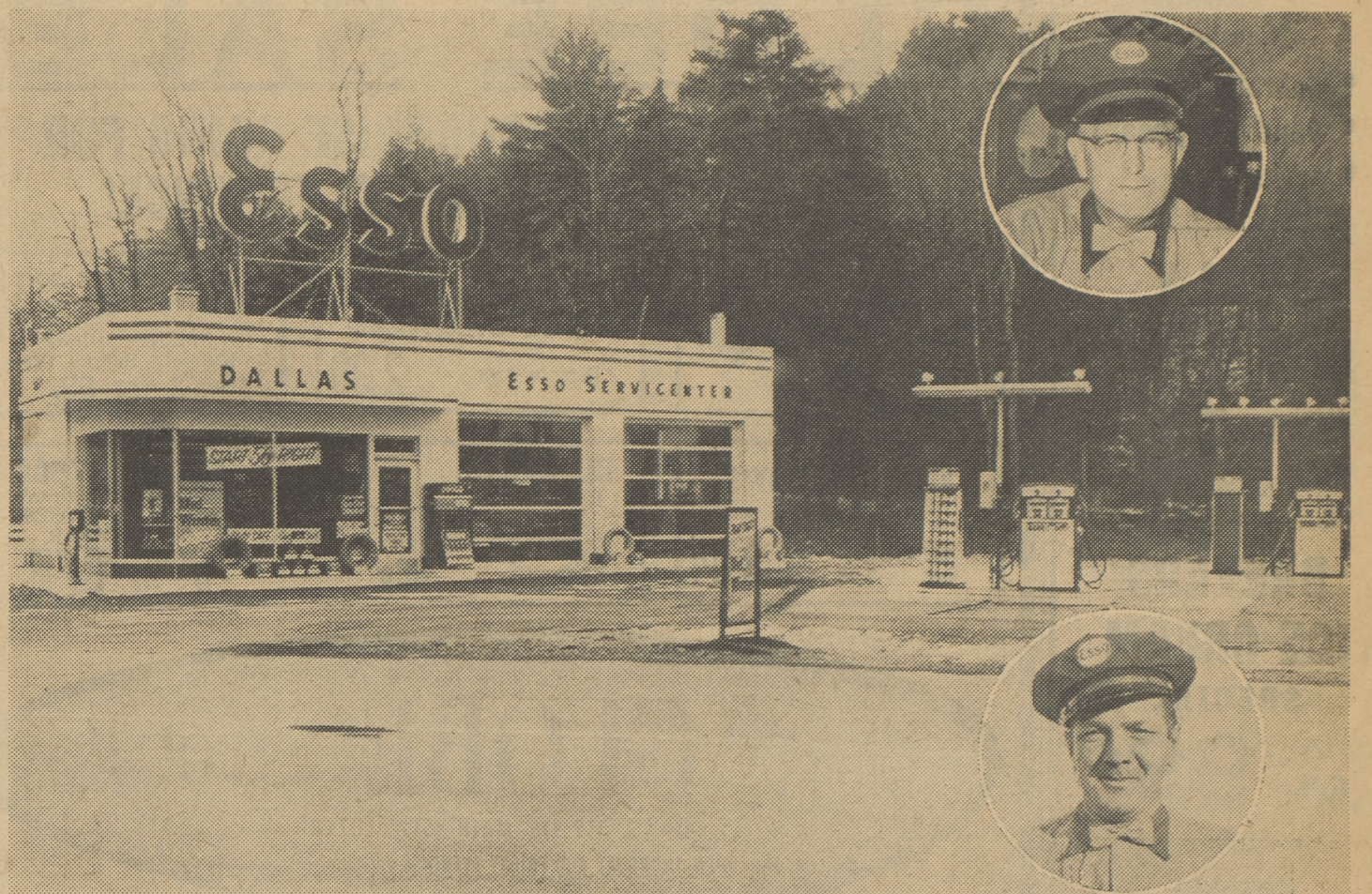
