## Your Neighbor Cooks

Buttermilk makes the filling of this pie creamy, smooth and delicate—similar to cheesecake. The recipe for this treat comes from Mrs. William Cairl, Jr., 9 Woodlawn Drive.

**Buttermilk Pie**  
½ recipe pie dough  
1 cup sugar  
3 tablespoons flour  
½ teaspoon salt  
3 egg yolks slightly beaten  
2 cups buttermilk  
¼ teaspoon vanilla  
¼ cup butter melted  
3 egg whites beaten until stiff  
Line a 9 inch pie pan with pie dough that has been rolled out to ¼ inch thickness. Fold edge to form standing rim; flute. Combine the sugar, flour and salt. Blend thoroughly. Combine buttermilk, vanilla and butter which has been cooled. Add to slightly beaten egg yolks. Add this mixture to the dry ingredients, blending thoroughly.
