

Back Mountain Cancer Crusade Off To Good Start, Goal \$3500

American Cancer Society's 1956 educational and fund-raising crusade for \$3,500 in the Dallas and Back Mountain area got underway this week with Mrs. Thomas B. Robinson directing a large group of volunteers.

The local goal is part of the \$50,000 quota which is being raised in Luzerne County and \$26,000,000 throughout the nation. More than 2,000 volunteers have offered their services in the county to join in the continuing battle against cancer—the Nation's No. 2 killer.

Mrs. Robinson said she was confident the quota in the Back Mountain area would be reached. Last year residents here contributed \$3,152.00 to the cause of cancer research, service to patients and education of the public.

During the month every adult resident will be asked to strike a double blow at cancer—with a checkup and a check—the local campaign chairman said.

The annual ACS crusade has a double objective which includes, be-

side fund-raising, far-reaching public education about cancer, Mrs. Robinson said. This is a life-saving program which helps to save as many as 80,000 lives a year from cancer.

Statistics show that there will be 1,800 active cancer cases in Luzerne County during 1956; and an estimated 675 deaths attributed to the disease. In the Dallas area, as elsewhere, nearly one out of every six deaths this year can be expected to be attributed to cancer.


