Mrs. Steele, 76, in failing health for several years, died Tuesday night of a sudden heart attack, after a day when she had felt in exceptionally good health, able to play with the little grandchild across the road at the Steele restaurant.

For twenty-five years Mr. and Mrs. John Steele operated the restaurant on Route 115 a short distance beyond the Pikes Creek intersection, now owned and operated by their son Basil, a teacher at Lehman-Jackson-Ross. Since its early beginning, the restaurant has been famous for its home-baked pies.

Mrs. Steele was very active at Maple Grove Church, a trustee and member of the official board, and treasurer of the WSCS.

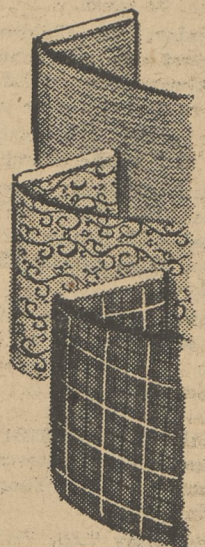
