

Capt. Harry D. Latimer Promoted To Major

Captain Harry L. Latimer of Paxton, Illinois, has been promoted to major in the Army. He is assigned to the Combat Developments Group, Headquarters Continental Army Command, Fort Monroe, Virginia.

A graduate of Paxton Community High School, he attended the University of Illinois and enlisted in the Army in 1943. He was commissioned after graduation from Infantry Officer Candidate School and served in Europe from 1944 to 1947. Later he served with the 82nd and 11th Airborne Divisions in this country and in 1953 was assigned to Headquarters, Army Antiaircraft Command in Korea. Prior to coming to Fort Monroe in July 1955, he was a student at the Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

His decorations include the Bronze Star Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster.

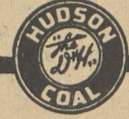
