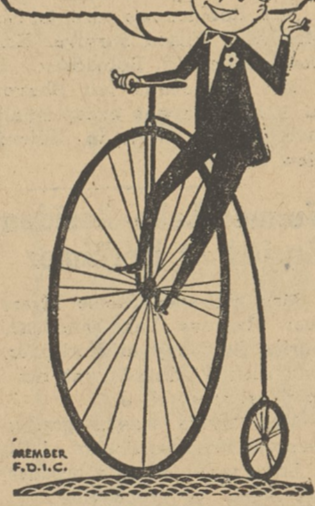
Nancy A. Wood, Engaged To Lt. Ronald Ertley

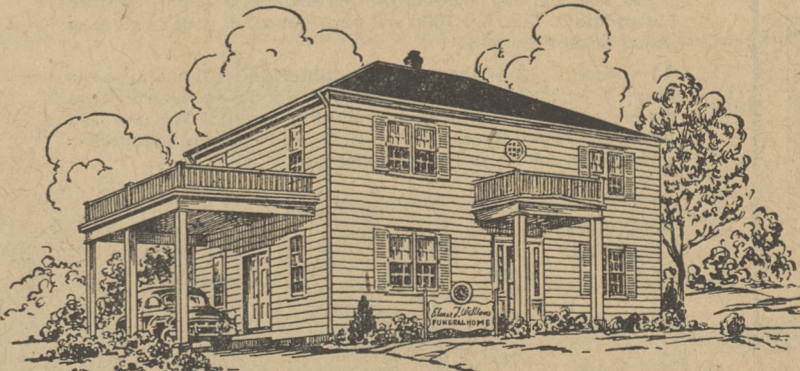
