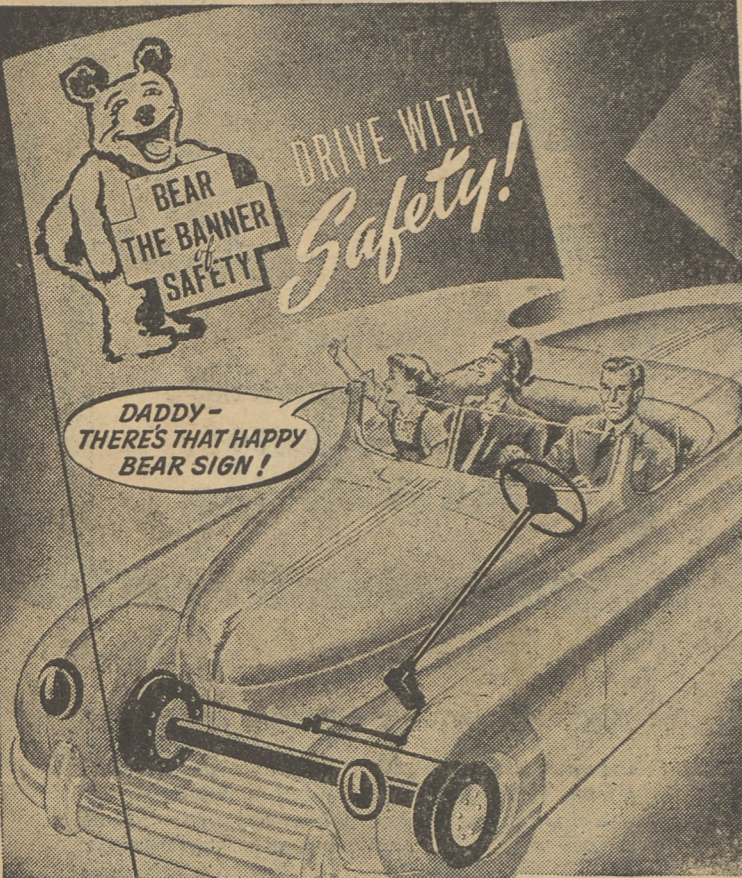
Philip F. Jackson Is Training At Fort Dix
