Drops Dead As He Trails Deer

Eugene Harvey, 80 Falls In Pasture

Eugene E. Harvey, 80, was discovered lying on the ground by a neighbor Monday morning shortly before 9, having apparently collapsed and died of a sudden heart attack while tracking a deer through the fresh-fallen snow in a pasture on his farm at Broadway.

Cleta Wolfe, also deer-hunting, saw Mr. Harvey earlier, waved to him, and a few minutes later saw that he had fallen. Alfred Bronson, deputy coroner, pronounced death due to heart failure. Mr. Harvey had been taking it easy for several months after a similar attack.

Funeral services were held yesterday from the Bronson Funeral Home, Rev. Oscar Saxe officiating. Burial was in Bloomingdale Cemetery.

Pallbearers were nephews: Leonard Harvey, Carl Harvey, Arden Harvey, Arlie Harvey, Robert Harvey, and Victor Cross.

Mr. Harvey was born in Bethel, son of the late Cyrus and Ada Meeker Harvey. For fifty-two years he lived at Broadway, where he belonged to the Methodist Church and served as its Sunday School superintendent for a number of years. He was a Huntington Township school director for twelve years, and served several terms as Republican committeeman.

He and his wife, the former Sufrona Long, marked their 55th wedding anniversary October 23.

He is survived by his widow; six children: Foster and Glen, Harveyville; Mrs. Eugene Huffman, Luzerne; Mrs. Emory Wolfe, Hunlock Creek RD; Mrs. Wesley Burgess, Rahway, N. 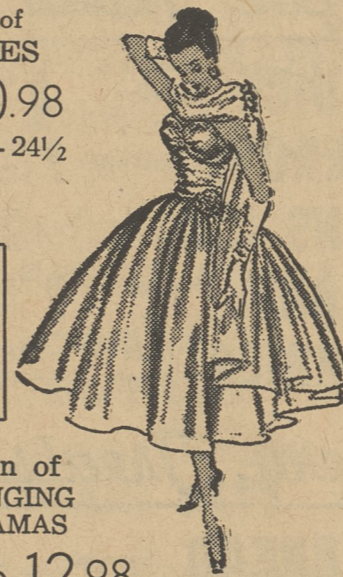
