THE BABY THAT NEVER GREW UP!

CHRISTMAS 1956. As this happy holiday season carols in upon the world once again, men's minds are crowded or clouded as never before with the stupendous, mystifying facts of the past twelve months. In the words of Thomas Paine, "These are the times that try men's souls."

"What", asks the inquiring mind, "does a baby, shivering in a manger, some nineteen hundred and sixty years ago have to do with these days' disturbances?" The answer is, "Precisely none at all, if the manger story ends in the stable!"

A beautiful story about a helpless baby in a stable with wise men peering over the shoulders of humble sheepherders, pulls at the heart strings, it causes women to weep, and men to lose control of their chins, but this reaction has little effect upon man and his problems.

The Christmas story is not completely told in the little town of Bethlehem. The Christmas story is completed in the mature life and death of the God-man Jesus Christ, who said, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

One of the most pathetic sights on the face of the earth is a child who never grew up, who is still in his cradle after ten or fifteen years of life.

Jesus Christ came into the world, not to remain an infant but to grow up and to confront men as God. Yet, at Christmas, everyone makes a sentimental response to the baby Jesus, but few make a moral response to the man, Christ Jesus.

The Christmas story effects today's problems only if it is allowed to point man to his relationship to the God who is all in all and who was in "Christ reconciling the world to himself."


