It is to determine what must be done to protect theoretically free American citizens and the nation's economy against a cynical labor hierarchy that threatens something new and unlovely in dictatorships.

Beck and his ilk are only symptoms. It is the disease that must be conquered if the patient is to live.

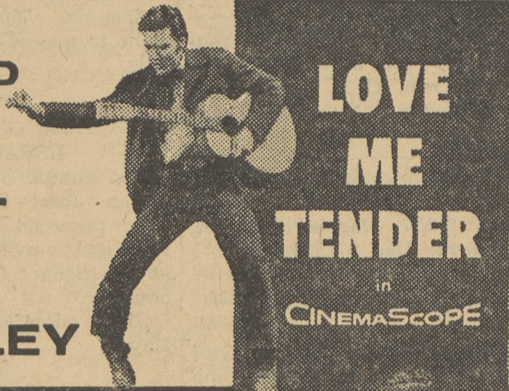

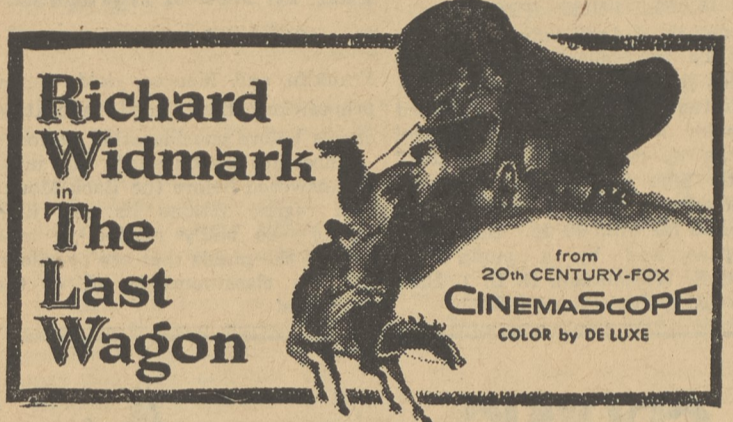
