John Crispell, 73, Dies Of Sudden Heart Attack

John M. Crispell, Beaumont, died Saturday morning in the home in which he was born seventy-three years ago, and had spent his entire life. Going about his work on the farm as usual, he was stricken with a heart attack. He was buried in Beaumont Cemetery Wednesday afternoon, Rev. A. Lewis Payne and Rev. Howard Deats conducting services from the home and from Bow-

mans Creek Free Methodist Church. His parents were the late Charles and Lydia E. Ayers Crispell, of pioneer stock. There are a number of branches of the Crispell family in the Beaumont-Noxen area. Mr. Crispell followed his father in tilling the soil. He was a member of Bowmans Creek Free Methodist Church, and much respected in the community.

He is survived by his widow, the former Helen May Hoover of Lehman; two sons: Albert, of Bristol, and Kenneth, of Luzerne; two daughters: Mrs. Leon Race, Kunkle, and Mrs. Ernest Brown, Tunkhannock R. D. 5; eight grandchildren; two brothers, Alfred of Noxen, and Corey, Dallas R. D.

A/1C Blaine's Body Arrives By Train

Fatally injured Tuesday morning in a traffic accident near Columbia, South Carolina, A/1C Daniel R. Blaine, Shavertown, died a few hours later in the Columbia Hospital. The body was brought to Wilkes-Barre by train Thursday afternoon and escorted by military guard to the Gail S. Hughes Funeral Home, Kingston. He will be buried this afternoon in Cedar Crest Cemetery, following services conducted at 2 p.m. from the funeral home by Rev. Joseph Sproule and Rev. Grove Armstrong, former and present ministers of Dallas Free Methodist Church of which he was a member.

Airman Blaine, 24, with three other airmen en route from Air Force Base Shaw, South Carolina, to Air Force Base Patrick in Florida, was a passenger in an Air Force car which went out of control on a curve and struck a tree. All passengers were injured and hospitalized.

Blaine attended Lake-Noxen and Wilkes-Barre schools. He re-enlisted in the Air Force a year and a half ago after honorable discharge in 1953. A native of Wilkes-Barre, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Blaine, he married the former Jean Bynon of Dallas, now employed at the Ann Wills Garment Company in Kingston. Blaine's last leave at home was March 18.

He is survived by his parents and his widow; five brothers: Sgt. Louis Blaine, U.S. Army at Fort Eustis, Virginia; Philip, California; Howard, Waymart; Andrew, Shavertown; and Raymond, Wilkes-Barre; two sisters: Mrs. Stella Roberts, Lee Park; and Mrs. Marjorie Shotwell, Virginia.

An elderly woman who had courageously overcome childhood disability was buried in Marsh Cemetery last Friday afternoon. Miss Myra Harding, 91, died at the home of her nieces, Harriet and Ruth Underwood, Forty Fort, where she had been unable to move for the past five years.

When Miss Harding was a little girl in Center Moreland, she was riding on a load of hay driven by her father, the late Isaac Harding. As the horses entered the barn, she was brushed off the load by the beams, and fell heavily, breaking her back. A cripple from early childhood, and becoming more deformed with the years, she was nonetheless able to act as telephone operator for many years for the Commonwealth Telephone Company, and she drove a team of ponies that was the envy of all the small boys of the neighborhood.

Lewis Underwood, Shavertown, a nephew, the son of her sister, is one of the surviving nephews and nieces.

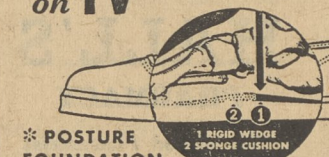

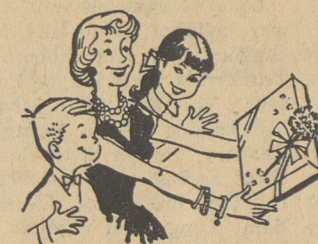

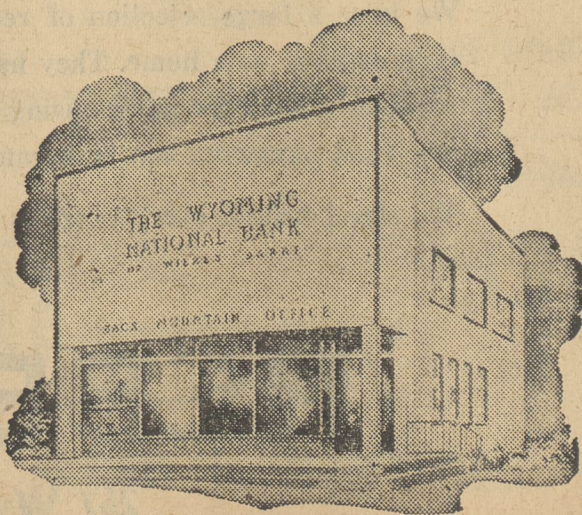
