Section 6 provided the method of execution of the bonds. Section 7 provided for the form of bond, the form of coupon and the form of endorsement. Section 8 provided for the pledge of the full faith and credit of the Township for the payment of the principal of the bonds and interest and state taxes accruing thereon. Section 9 provided for the levy of a tax sufficient to pay the principal of the bonds and the interest thereon. Section 10 provided for the establishment of a Sinking Fund. Section 11 provided for the filing of a financial statement in the Court of Quarter Sessions. Section 12 provided for the certification and filing of proceedings relating to the bond issue with the Department of Internal Affairs. Section 13 repealed all ordinances inconsistent with the said ordinance.
