## New Preacher Arrives At Maple Grove Church

Members of the pastoral committee of Maple Grove Methodist Church were on hand Monday night to welcome the new minister, Robert M. Brittain when he and his wife drove up to the parsonage at 9:30 p.m. after a long hard motor trip from Vanceburg, Ky.

Mr. Brittain who succeeds Rev. Paul Clemow will preach in the Maple Grove, Meeker and Loyalville Churches on Sunday.

Born and reared in Weaverville, S. C., Mr. Brittain received his local preacher's license in the Methodist Church at the age of seventeen and began preaching in the charges of the Asheville Circuit. In 1955 he accepted a call to the Mauckport Charge in the Southern Indiana Conference and in 1956, following his marriage, he moved to Vanceburg to serve a five point charge.

Next month he will enter Temple Theological Seminary in Philadelphia, returning to his charge week-ends.

## Five Hundred Cattle Entered In NEPA Shows

Thursday Through Saturday Will Be Big Days At Tunkhannock

With eight area Local Dairy Cattle Shows in progress to select entries for the Eleventh Annual NEPA Cattle Show which is comprised of daughters of NEPA sires, one of the largest and best dairy cattle shows in Northeastern Pennsylvania is in the making.

The annual event includes four separate shows staged simultaneously on August 28, 29 and 30 at NEPA grounds in Tunkhannock and will attract 500 head of fine dairy cattle of all breeds as well as thousands of spectators.

The first day is for youth, when more than 100 boys and girls will parade 200 4-H and F.F.A. project heifers in the annual Northeast Round-up. These shows are conducted independently but at the same time under a large tent featuring two rings. The 4-H show is conducted by the County Agents of Northeastern Pennsylvania with Joe Staley of Wayne County in charge. The F.F.A. show will include Vocational Agriculture project heifers and is conducted by the Area Supervisors with Howard Newcomer directing. A renewed confidence in our future dairymen is yours for attending as these top of the farm youth show their top of the crop of dairy heifers.

The main event is on Thursday, when 250 of the finest NEPA bred cattle will compete for \$1,200,000 in prizes and championships before nationally approved judges, Bill Hepburn and Cuthbert Nairn. This show is one of the oldest in its class in the United States and attracts hundreds of interested dairymen and observers annually. J. N. Carpenter is the superintendent.

The final day will feature Holsteins from the ten County area for the Annual Northeast Black and White Show. Over 100 head will participate and the tops in each class will be eligible to show in Harrisburg at the State B & W Show in September. Winners are candidates for the All Pennsylvania titles, and several All-American winners and competitors were launched in previous years. Bill Conyngham of Hillside Farms is in charge and Donald Seipt of Easton will judge.

Then on Saturday, August 31st there will be a Sheep Field Day under auspices of Wyoming and Lackawanna County Breeders. Educational demonstrations will feature the program.

The public is cordially invited to these events. No admission charges and plenty of free parking space is available. Food and milk will be available and a large show tent with seats is provided for comfort. Don't miss this opportunity.

## Slaughter Of Hawks On Larksville Mountain Barred By New State Law

Carl C. Stainbrook, Supervisor, Pennsylvania Game Commission, Forty Fort, has announced that recent session legislation prohibits the hunting and killing of all hawks in the following areas: That area West of the Delaware River and North of Route 22 from Easton to Harrisburg; bounded on the West by the Susquehanna River to and following the West Branch of the Susquehanna River to the intersection of Highway Route 405; then in a Northeasterly direction along Route 405 to the intersection of Route 115 at Hughesville; then in an Easterly direction along Route 115 to the intersection of Route 29 near Pikes Creek. (Note: This takes in a small portion of Lycoming County); then in a Northerly direction along Route 29 through Tunkhannock and Montrose to the Pennsylvania-New York State boundary; then in an Easterly direction along the New York-Pennsylvania boundary to the intersection of the Delaware River, north of Hancock, N. Y.

The area closed to all hawk hunting, includes the great flyways for Hawk migrations along the Susquehanna River. One of the slaughter spots has been for years along the ridge of Larksville Mountain in Jackson Township.


