Lehman Operetta Tonight At 8 In School Gym

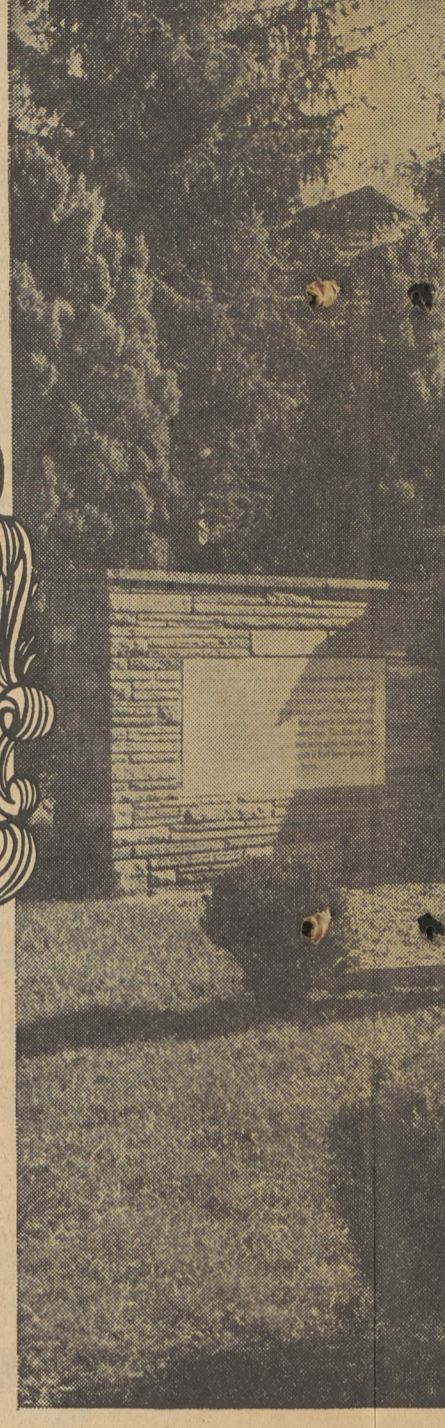

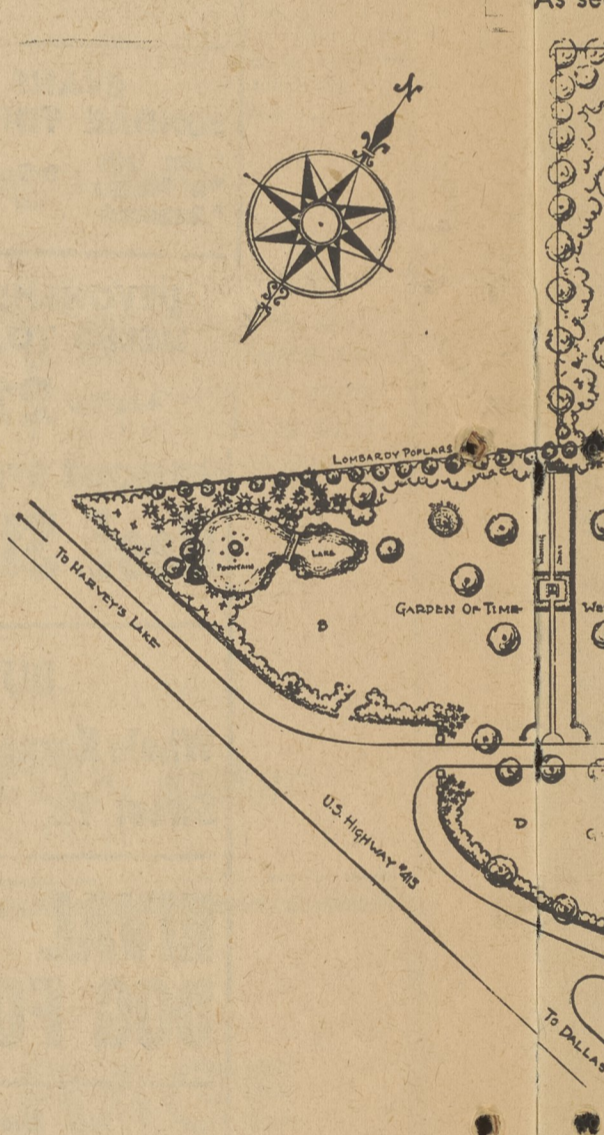
