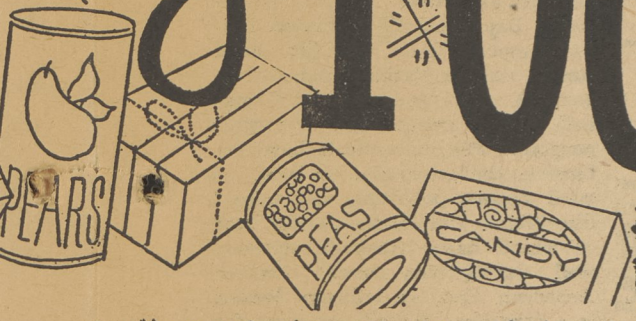

Federal Estimated Tax Payment Now Due

According to the District Director of Internal Revenue, about 35,000 individuals in the Scranton District are now receiving bills for the January 15 installment of estimated income tax.

The Director emphasized the importance of making prompt payment of the amounts due within the time stated on the bill, and pointed out that the law carries provisions for application of severe penalties for failure to make proper reports and timely payments on account of estimated taxes.

The January payment represents the fourth quarterly payment of estimated taxes. Taxpayers who have not filed or paid estimated taxes for prior quarters should take immediate steps to file, in order to minimize their liability for penalty.
