The couple will reside in their own home at Lake Silkworth.

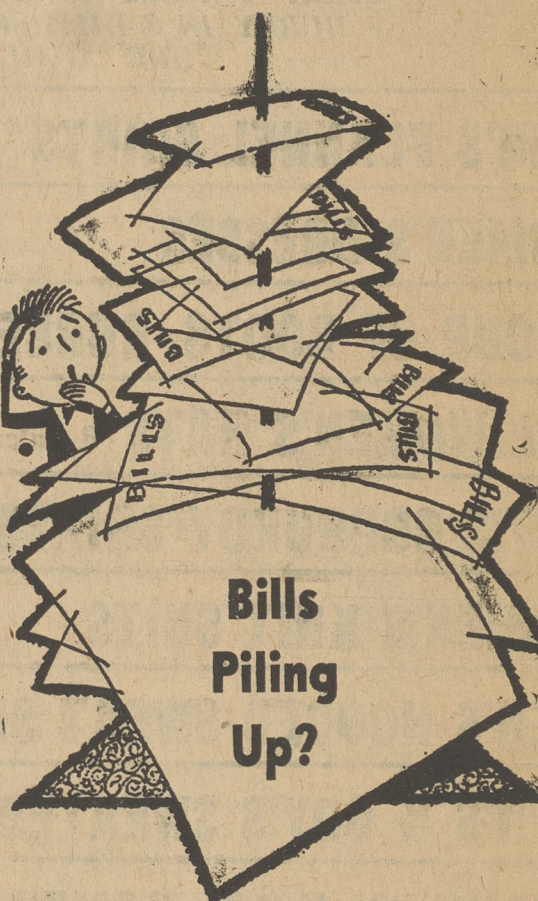

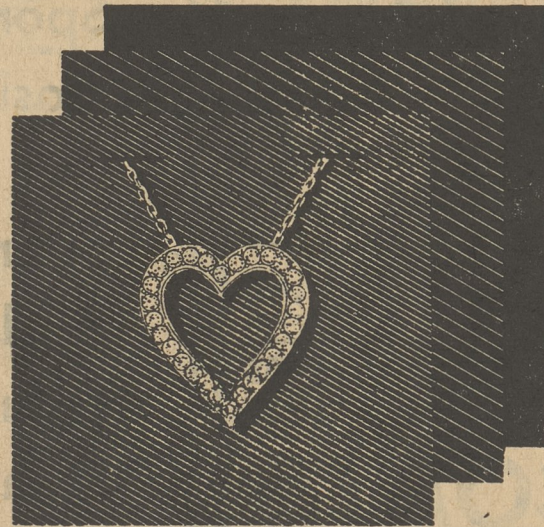

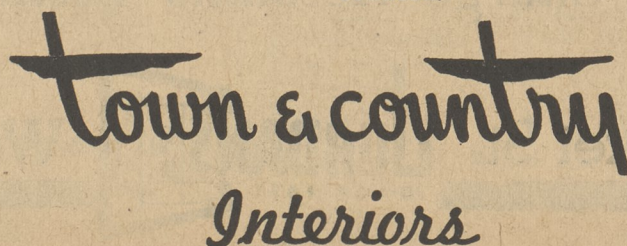
