Shavertown Topples Huntsville

Shavertown nailed down third place with a decisive 64-52 win over Huntsville. The loss for Huntsville put them in fourth place. 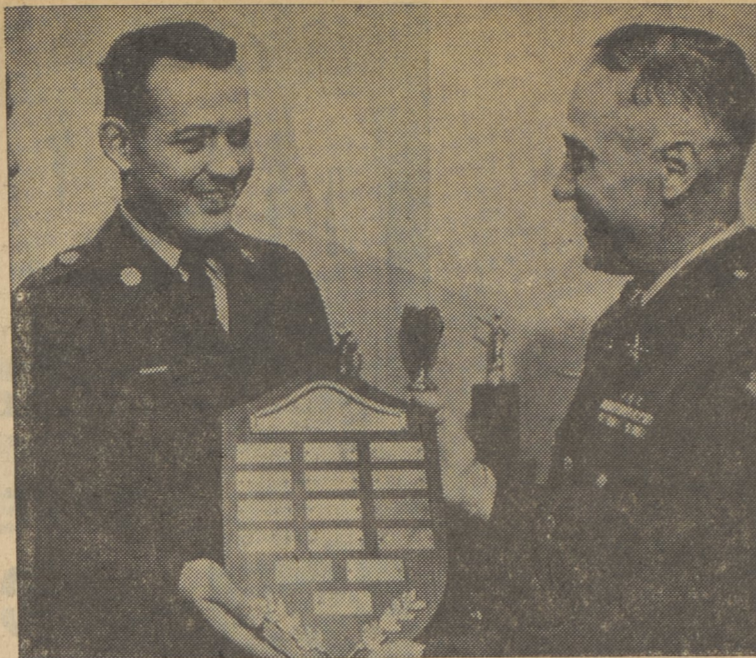

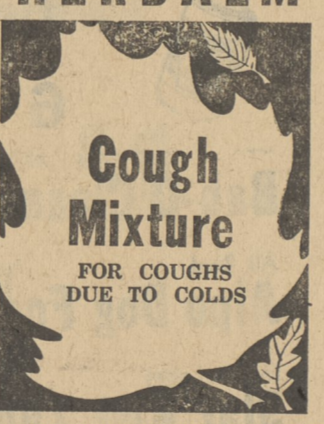
