

Reaction Time In Driver Test Nationwide Company Sends Special Car

Students Test

For Demonstration

A traffic safety demonstration, presented by Nationwide Insurance Company, was presented for both Dallas Area Senior High Schools ast week.

After a film, "Chain Reaction," George M. Tewksbary, demonstrator, took the student groups outdoors for the demonstration.

The car was equipped with three guns. The first fired with the signal 'stop;" the second fired when the driver "hit" the brakes. The third fired when the car came to a stop. The distance between the first and second shots was the reaction distance! between the second and third was the braking distance.

The tests were made on the roads n front of the schools.


