## Darlene Dalton

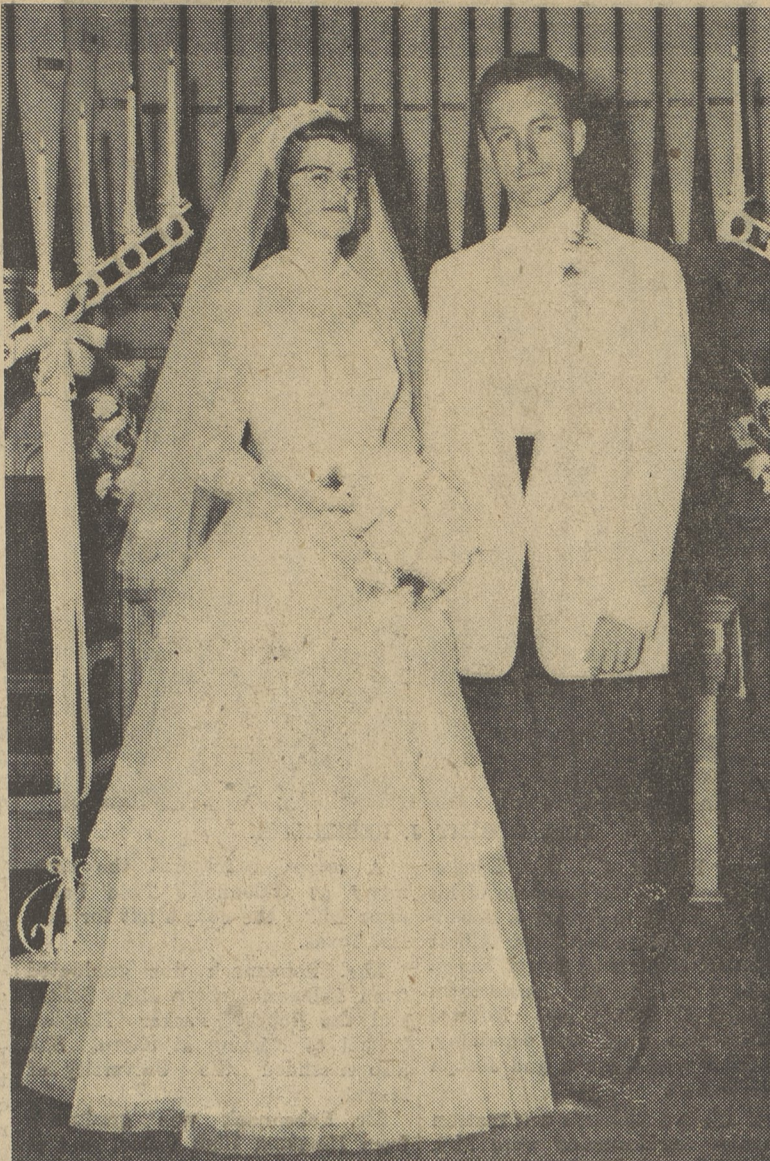
