Jerome Shilanski Is Aboard The USS Miller

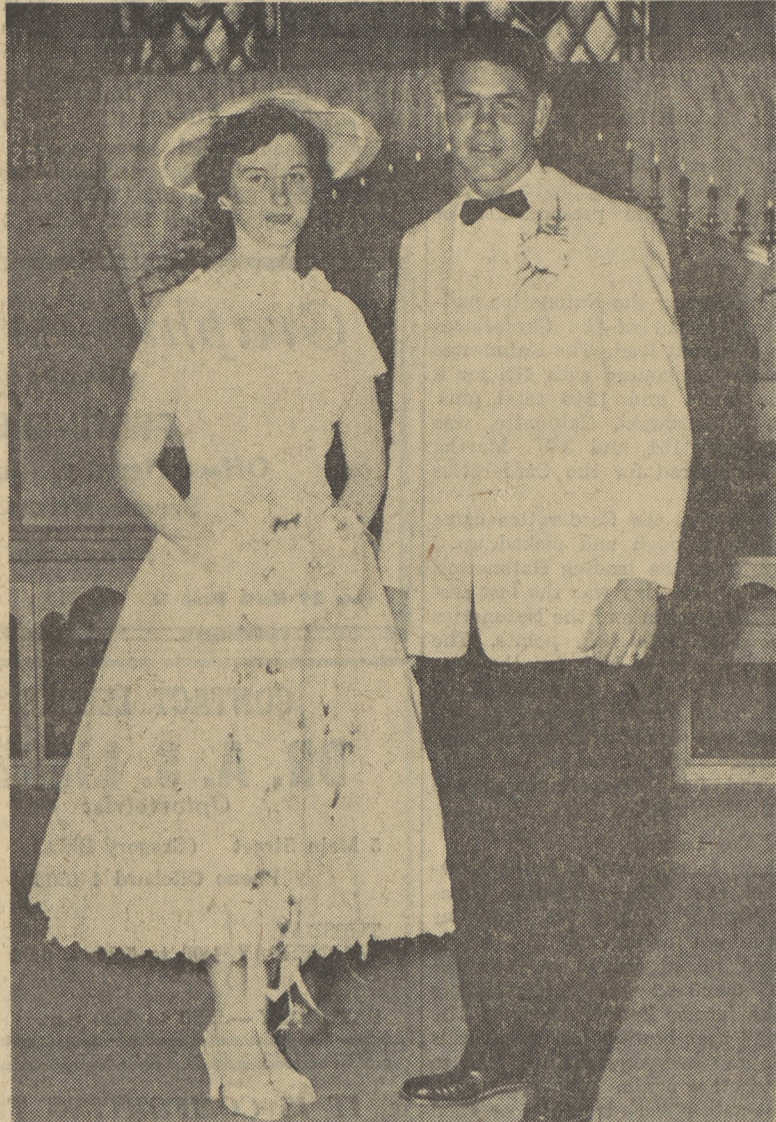

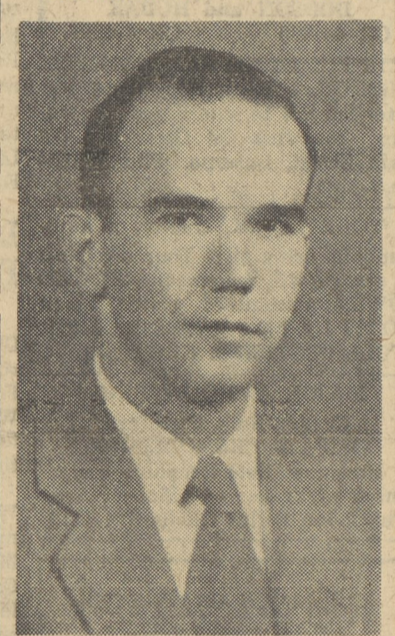
Home From Philadelphia

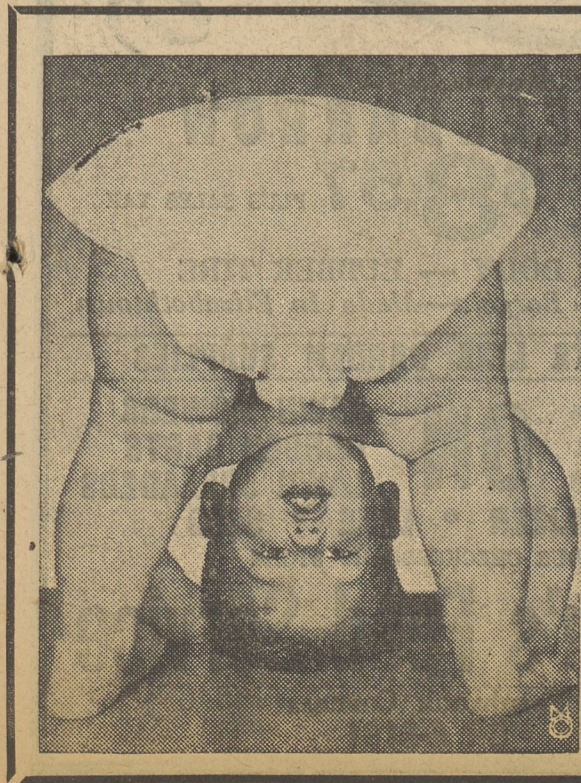
