Barre, Pa.  
2. AUTORAMA (Auto Show): July 18-19—Kingston Armory.  
3. Giants' Despair Road Races: July 18, trials; July 19, for  
Record. At U. S. Army Ordnance tank testing course, at Route 11,  
Berwick.  
4. Sports Cars Drag Races: (Invitational, sponsored by N.E.  
Pennsylvania Timers Association and Nascar)—July 20, Forty Fort  
Airport (across river from Wilkes-Barre).

**Name:**  
Giants' "Giants' Despair"—Dubbed by a newsman in 1906 or  
1907 after Part I of John Bunyan's Pilgrims Progress: "Now there  
was a castle called Doubting Castle, the owner whereof was Giant  
Despair. . . . Through the years it became pluralized. (Describes  
difficulty, of course.)

**Courses:**  
Road Race Track at Berwick: Leased by hill climb association  
from U. S. Army Ordnance. Track cost \$300,000 to build. Is: 1-mile,  
kidney-shaped, paved, 30-50 feet wide, banked on curves, is fast,  
tight, competitive. Infield viewing. Fast start-finish stretch.  
Hill Climb Course at Laurel Run: Measured-mile, bristling  
turns, 22% grades; Double-S turns, Devil's Elbow Turn; EARLY  
CLIMBS WERE IN 1905, 1907, 1908, 1909, 1910. (World War in-  
tervened). Early course was dirt—cows roamed—no fences. Spon-  
sored by Wilkes-Barre Automobile Club, sanctioned by AAA HILL  
CLIMB ASSOCIATION. REVIVED as annual event in 1951—spon-  
sored by Giants' Despair Hill Climb Association, sanction by SCCA.

## Mrs. Anderson Is X-Rayed Again After Car Crash

**Trailer Wheels Ride Over Crushed Car, Endanger 3 Lives**

Mrs. Fred Anderson, Shavertown, returned to Nesbitt Memorial Hospital on Saturday for further X-Rays to supplement those taken immediately after the car crash in which she was injured early Wednesday afternoon. She is still painfully bruised and shaken. Spine, neck and skull X-Rays were taken. Her uncle, Otto Bamert of Kingston, 73, driver of the wrecked car, taken unconscious to Nesbitt, was discharged on Sunday.

Mrs. Anderson had a narrow escape from death when the wheels of a mammoth tractor-trailer crushed the car in which she was a passenger, leaving it a total wreck on Route 11, near the turnoff to Hunlock Creek.

Mrs. Anderson, in the front seat, when she felt the roof caving in like matchwood, threw her arm over the young cousin who was sitting beside her, drawing her head into her lap and crouching over her to protect her with her own body.

Mr. Bamert was thrown out of the driver's door under the trailer, and lay there unconscious while the trailer jackknifed and shuddered to a stop against the mountain side.

Mrs. Anderson made her way from the wrecked car, and called to bystanders for help in rescuing her uncle. Gasoline was pouring from the tank, adding danger of fire to the wreck. Mrs. Dorothy Stortz, 27, her cousin, seven and a half months pregnant, was entirely uninjured.

When the trailer started to climb the rear of the car, Mrs. Anderson expected instant death. "This is IT," she said to herself. The wheel stopped within an inch of her head.

Mr. Bamert was bleeding freely from numerous lacerations. A passing motorist drove the trio to Nesbitt Memorial Hospital, where they were met by Dr. Richard Crompton, who left a filled waiting room when he found that Mrs. Anderson had been in a wreck.

One of the oddities that Mrs. Anderson remembers, is that there were shoes everywhere. The impact was violent enough to tear off three pairs of shoes and scatter them. All three victims lost their glasses.

The 1951 Kaiser was a total wreck. Carl Cunningham, West Virginia, driver of the trailer truck, admits responsibility. Pulling out of line to pass Mr. Bamert's car, he struck the car with the right rear wheel of the trailer.
