

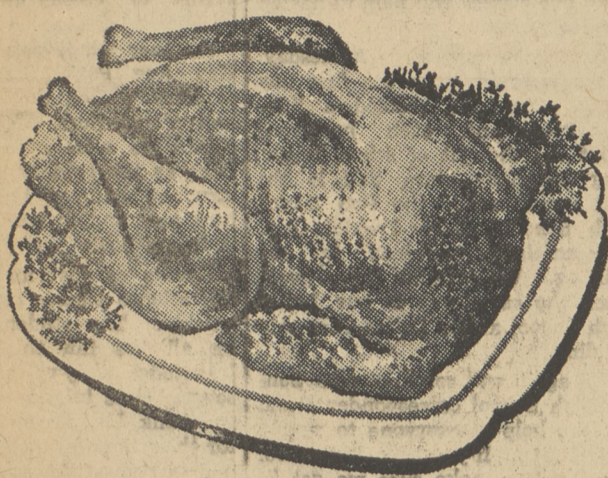

Mr. Jones lived next door to his daughter, Mrs. Charles Nuss, in a home which was built twelve years ago so that he and his wife might be close to their daughter's family. Mrs. Jones, the former Nellie Pemberton, died five years ago.

A native of Wales, Mr. Jones came to this country when a lad of twelve, he lived in Kingston for many years, being introduced to Dorrance-ton Methodist Church. Upon moving to Lehman he joined Lehman Methodist Church and the Men's Bible Class. He was the son of the late Daniel and Hannah Jones.
