In honor of our football team, the Football Mothers' Association is giving them a banquet in the gym. Each player may invite a guest. We hear that most of them have invited some one. This is their night.

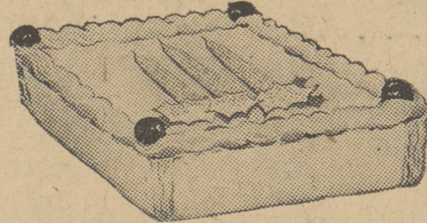

Success was again achieved by the Lake-Lehman football team Saturday when it defeated West Wyoming.

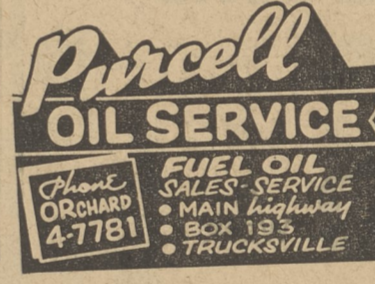
