Line Expected Home Sometime Next Week

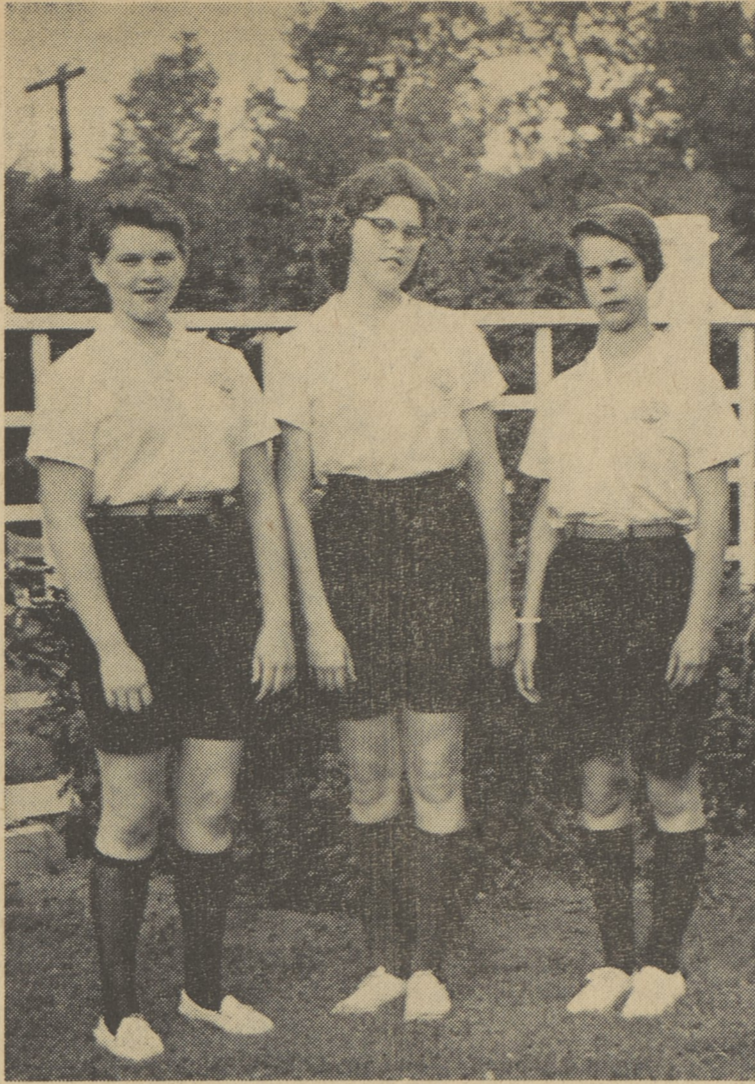
Austin Line, a patient at Wilkes-Barre Veterans' Hospital for the

Former Dallas Man Dead At 71

Orville Adelman Dies In Arlington, Virginia

Orville Adelman, 71, one of the founders of Dr. Henry M. Laing Fire Company, died of a heart attack at his home in Arlington, Virginia, on Saturday June 23. He was buried at Arlington.

A lumberman and building contractor most of his life, Mr. Adelman operated a lumberyard on Lake Street, Dallas, for a number of years. He built the home now owned by A. C. Devens and the big buildings back of the home were his lumber sheds.

Mr. Adelman was a charter member of Dallas Rotary Club. After leaving Dallas he continued in the building contracting business.

His first wife, the former Natalie Ide, died some years after the family left Dallas.

Mr. Adelman suffered a heart attack about two years ago but had been in good health since then and was superintending the removal of a shade tree from in front of his home in Arlington when he was stricken fatally.

Beside his second wife, Susan, he leaves a son, Albert, of Silver

Spring, Md., a granddaughter and the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Charles Mayer, Lake Street, Dallas; William, Detroit; Mrs. Berta Shepherd, Ardsley, Pa.; and Mrs. Jennie Baer, Koonsville, Pa. A daughter, Marie, died while the family lived in Dallas.

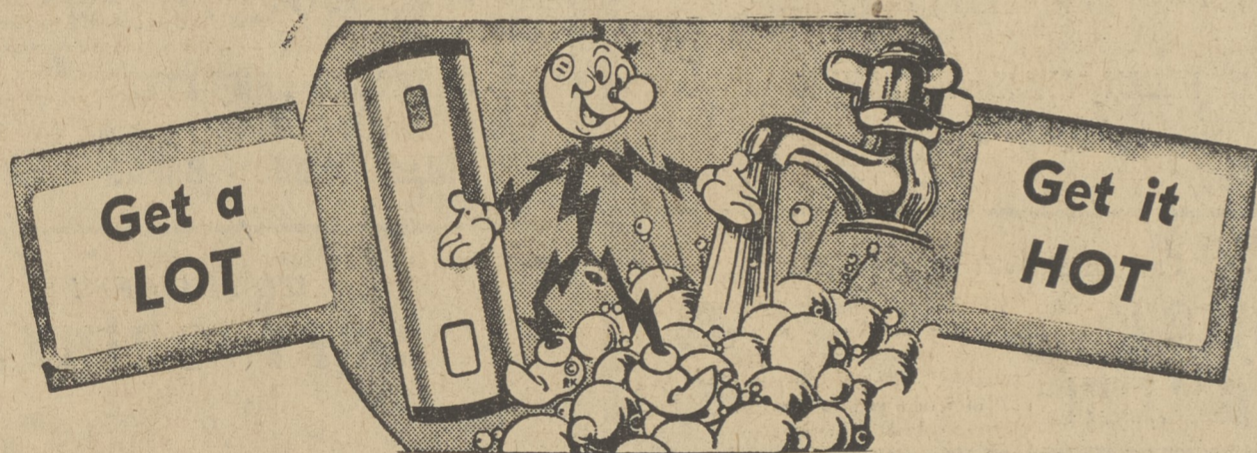

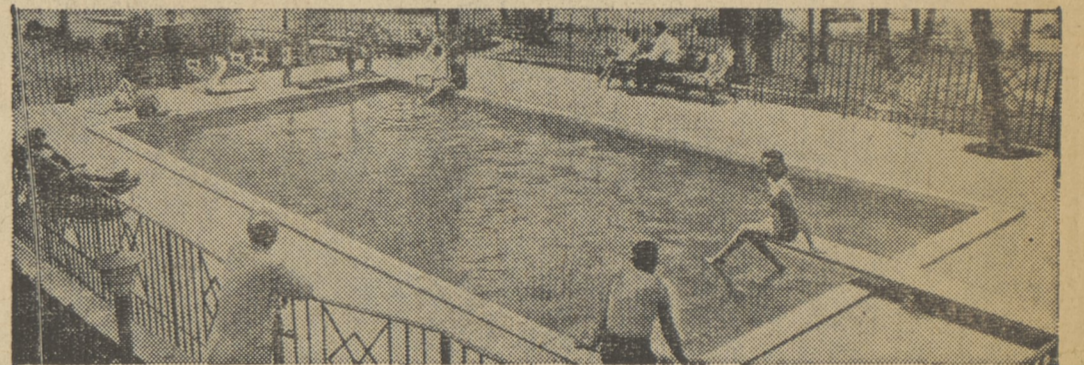

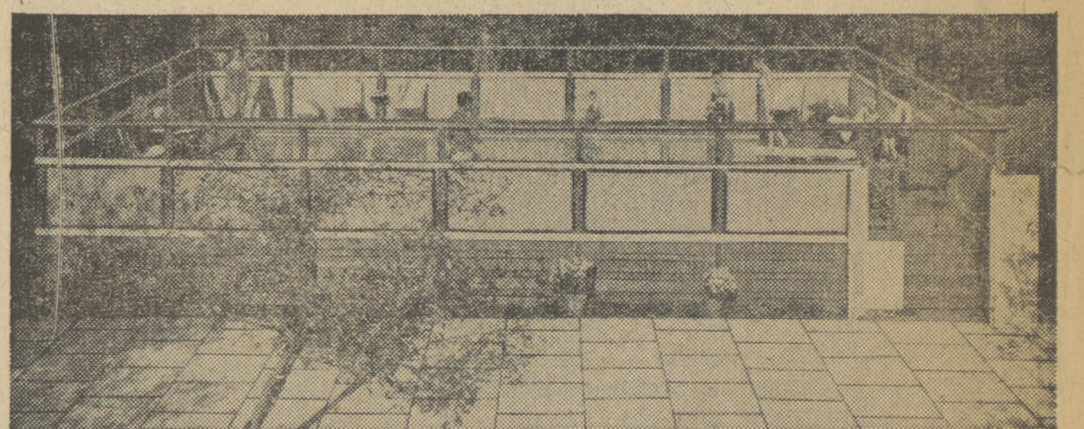
