The hostess with the mostest consideration does not press her guests to drink alcohol.  
In most groups of people there are usually one or two or more who face the problem of alcoholism.  
The hostess should, therefore, make it as easy as possible for these potential alcoholics to mingle with other guests without embarrassment.  
The choice of accepting or declining an alcoholic drink must, of course, be up to the guest.  
But the hostess can help her guests make a decision by always having plenty of fruit juices and other non-alcoholic beverages on hand.  
"Alcoholism is but one manifestation of a tremendous health problem," declared Doctor Marvin A. Block of Buffalo, New York, Chairman of the American Medical Association's Committee on Alcoholism.  
"Drinking is an attempt to escape reality by the use of a socially accepted drug," explained Doctor Block, speaking before the 108th annual meeting of the AMA at Atlantic City last week.  
"While well adjusted people may drink alcohol without fear of becoming addicted, many who drink excessively are not aware of their own maladjustments," added Doctor Block.  
Doctor Block further pointed out that once a patient becomes addicted to alcohol and drinks compulsively, he can no longer drink with impunity.  
The medical profession has recog-

nized alcoholism as a disease, thus putting increased pressure on the physician to take care of these patients.  
Hostesses are eager to have their guests enjoy themselves, and for this reason they are likely to serve the drinks generously.  
A non-alcoholic punch, for those who shouldn't drink alcohol looks like, pours like, but does not act like an intoxicant.  
Be good to your guests, give them a choice.
