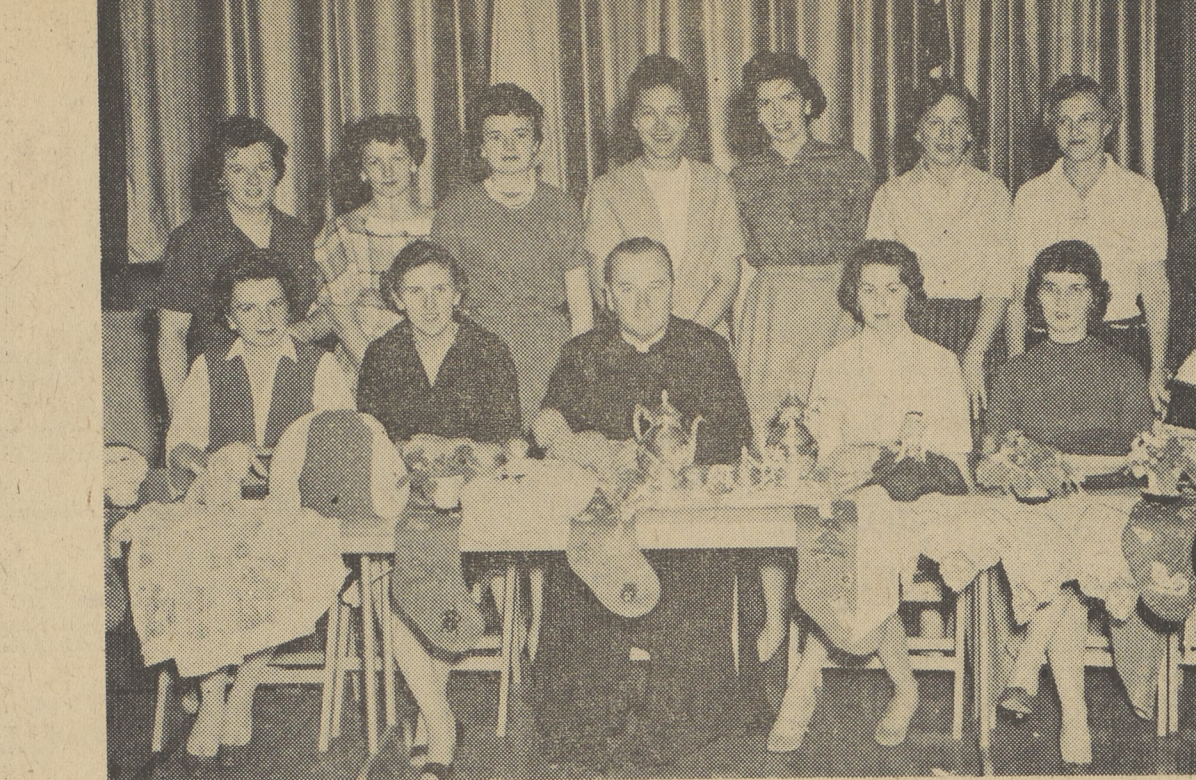
## Reynolds Class Plans Election Day Meals

### J. H. Haertter, 78, Dies After Illness

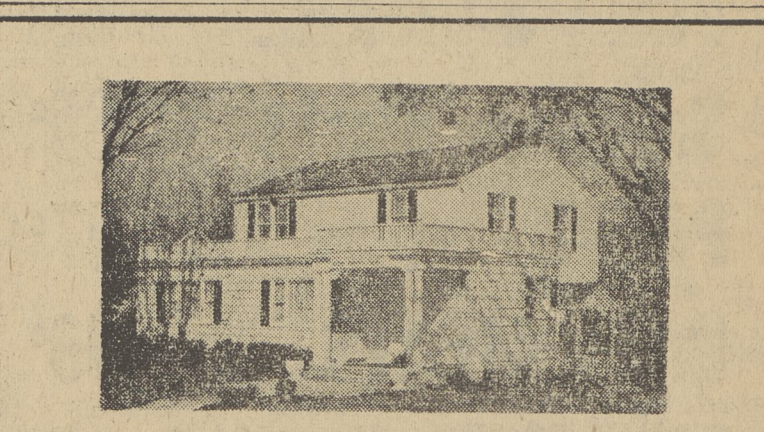
