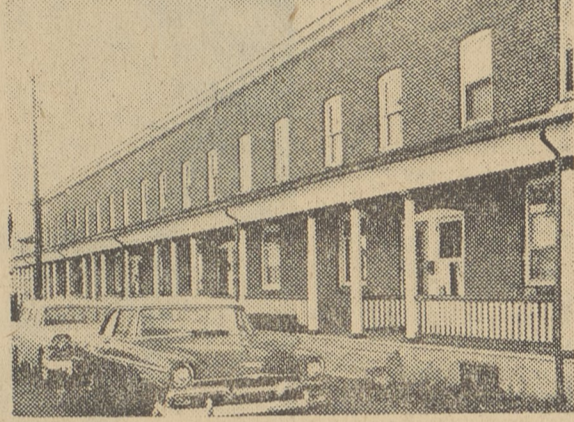

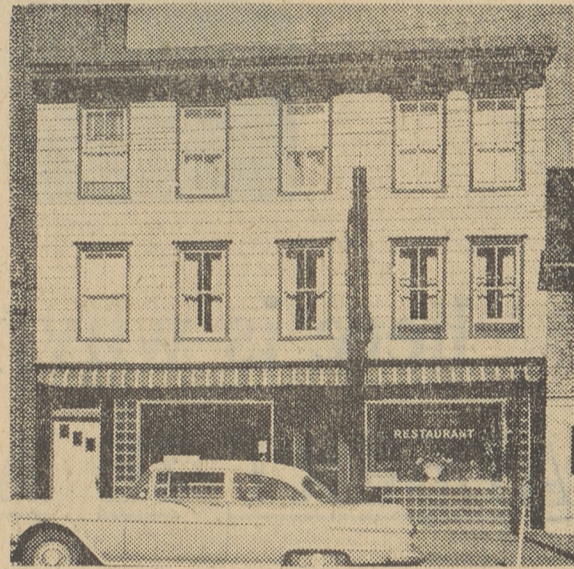

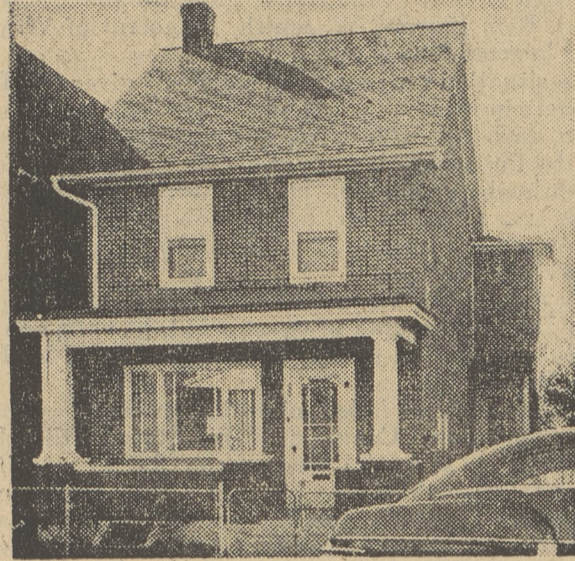
232 E. Beech Street, Each Unit

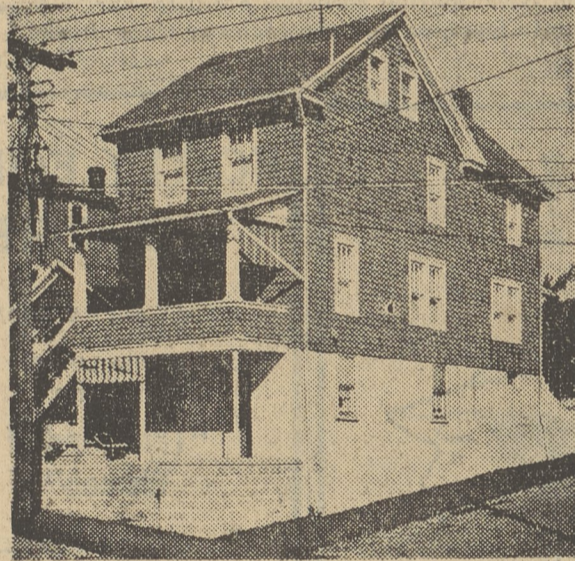

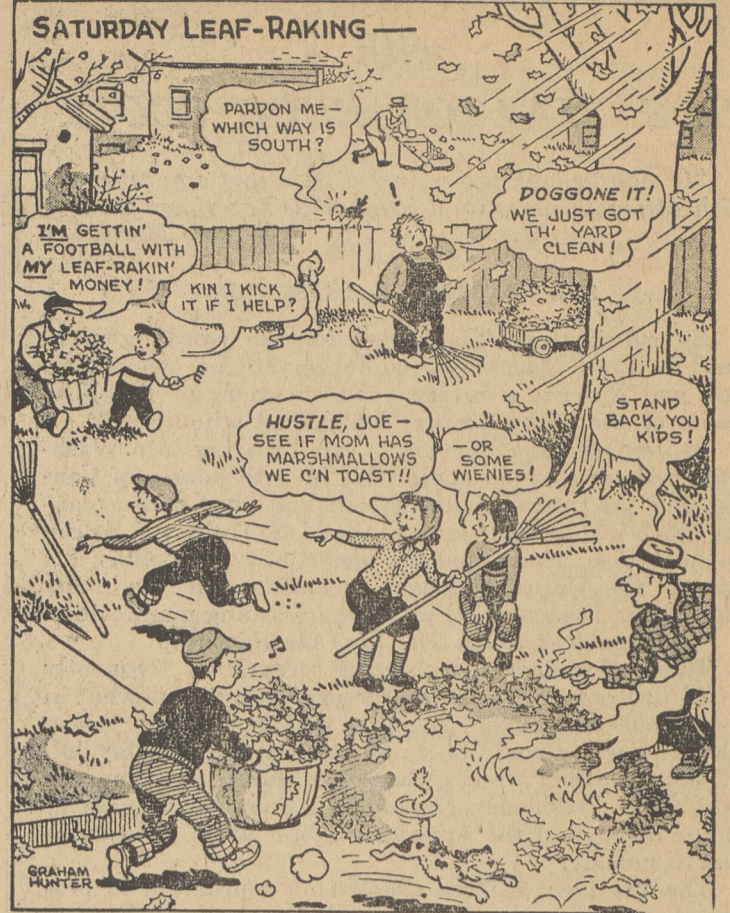
