Frank Hilstolski Sr., Carverton dairy farmer, died Friday night at his home after a heart attack. A mass of requiem was celebrated Tuesday morning from St. Francis Cabrini Church, followed by burial at Mt. Olivet. In death, he returned to his own home acreage, which had been sold to the St. Francis Cabrini parish when a portion of the dairy farm was given up.

He was a native of Poland, coming to this country fifty-three years ago. For many years he operated a grocery business in Upper Pittston, and was also owner-operator of a dance hall.

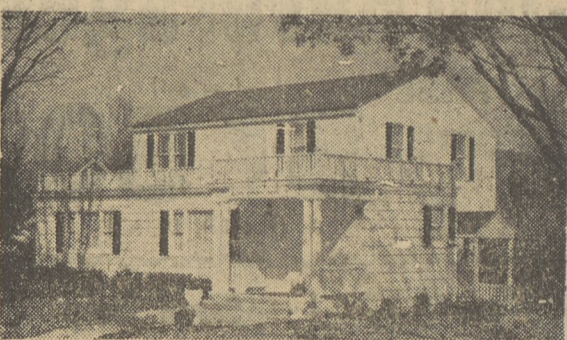

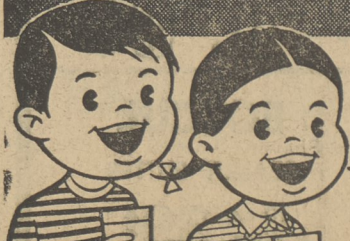

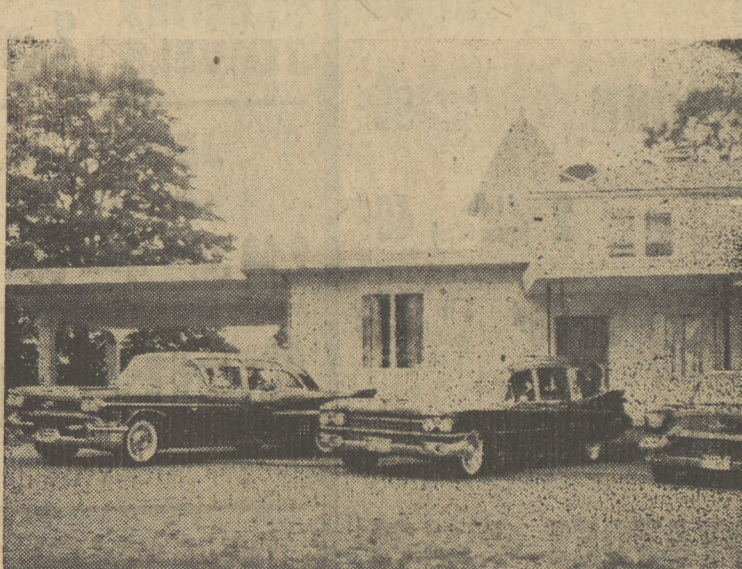
