Herbert A. Lundy Dies In Florida

Herbert A. Lundy, 65, former Dallas businessman, who died Friday night in Florida, will be buried tomorrow afternoon in Evergreen cemetery, Rev. Frederick Eiland conducting services from Williams Funeral Home.

George M. Dallas F&AM Lodge, will conduct services tonight at 8. Friends may call this afternoon or evening.

Mr. Lundy had been a patient three weeks at Coral Gables Veterans Hospital before his death.

He was a well known figure in Dallas where he was Township Tax Collector and operated a restaurant on Main Street for fifteen years.

Son of the late James and Grace Nunn Lundy, he was born July 24, 1904, in Easton. He had resided in Dallas 29 years prior to moving to Florida in 1938. Mr. Lundy was associated with his brother, Walter, in the operation of Lundy electric Company, Wilkes-Barre, previously.

A veteran of World War I, he served with the 29th Division in France. He was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Shavertown; Lodge 443, F&AM, Anniston; Alas-Keystone Consistory, Scranton; Royal Order of Jesters, Irem Temple and Shrine Club. A charter member and director of Wyoming Valley Motor Club, he was former secretary and director of Susquehanna Savings and Loan Association and a member of American Legion Post 142, Pampho Beach, and Pompano Beach Power Squadron.

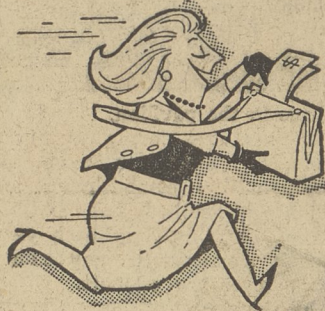
