Larry graduated from Westmoreland High School a year ago and since that time has been in training as an air mechanic, but Fort Bragg, home of the 82nd Airborne, is near-by and Larry decided to become a paratrooper during his spare time.

Each successful jump increases his pay. His highest jump was from 12,000 feet and his worst one was his first. "Believe me I was really scared especially when the old hands played a trick on us new recruits."
