Bible Prophecy
Rev Bob Boyd will conduct services at Glenview Primitive Methodist Church in Fernbrook, January 8 at 9:55 a.m. and continuing nightly at 7:30 p.m. Rev. Andrew Derrick announces. Rev. Bob Boyd was former pastor of the Little White Church of Conklin N.Y. and its T.V. program "Down Memory Lane."
Pastor Boyd presents "Christian Evidences and Bible Prophecy" in color movies and slides. He was a staff member of the Wheaton College Archaeological Expedition at the Old Testament site of Dothan in Northern Palestine.
Color slides, titled "Dead Stones with Living Messages," show many excavated sites of Buried Bible cities and objects which were found in these Bible-land cities, including the Dead Sea caves and scrolls. Many pictures show how the Bible is building the new nation of Israel. Several excavated objects will be on display — lamps and oil cruses of Christ's day; tear bottles such as King David used as recorded in Psalm 56:8; clay tablets and scarabs; implements of war used in Elijah's day, such as sling stones, spear point, and flint axe; burial juglet for food; ladies jewelry of queen Jezebel's time; stone age loom weight; and first century coins.
Also on display will be the rod and staff of the Twenty Third Psalm, and a crown of thorns made with thorns from brush which grows near Calvary, where Christ was crucified.
The Public is invited to these services.
