

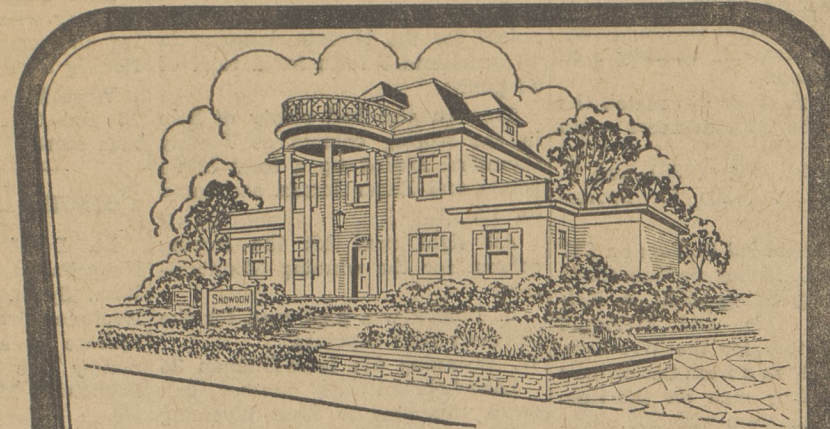
Episcopal Women Plan Card Party

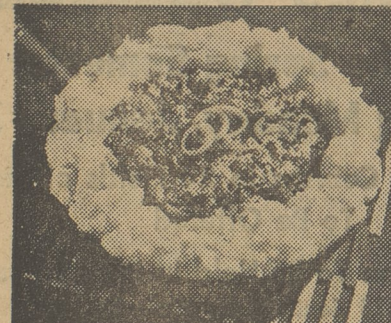

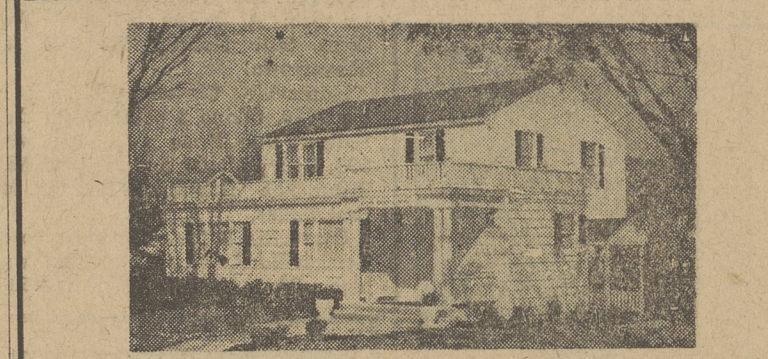
