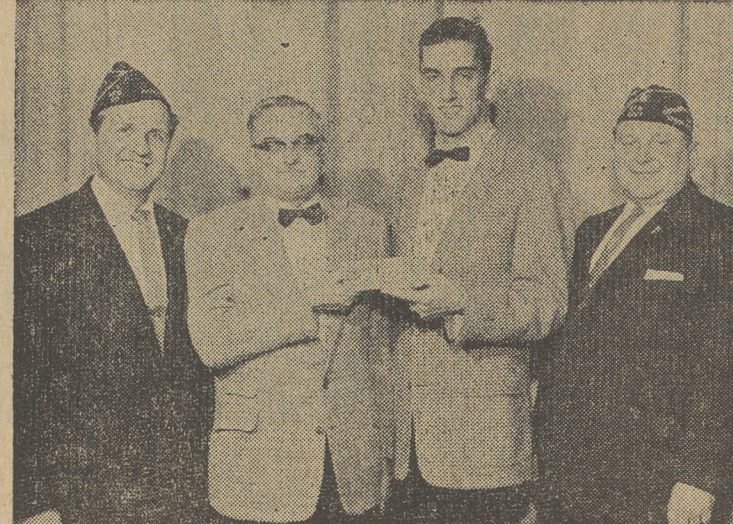
Transferred From Little Rock, Ark., To Okinawa
