A second organizational meeting, for fathers only, will be held tonight at the Back Mountain YMCA. Fathers of boys of six, seven or eight who are interested in doing something worthwhile with their sons are invited to attend. The purpose of tonight's meeting is to form local tribes of from six to eight fathers and sons. After the tribes are formed each tribe will commence work on its tom tom, totem pole and individual head bands for each brave.

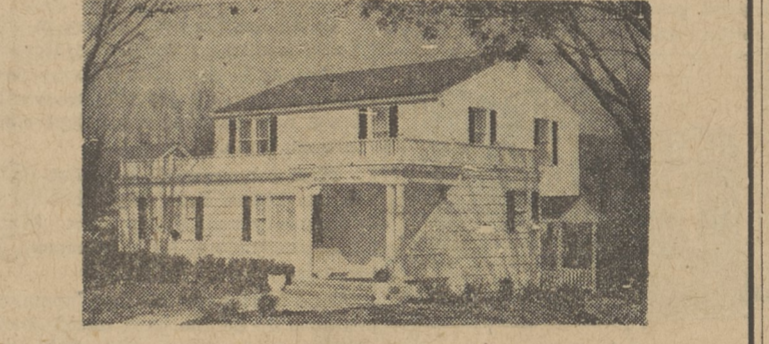

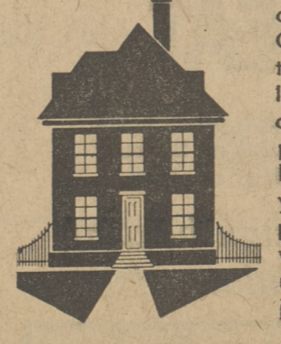
